JOB DESCRIPTION - MIDDAY MEAL SUPERVISOR

The post holder will be responsible to the Senior Midday Supervisor and through her to the Head teacher.

Responsibilities

This job involves the supervision of school children during the midday break with a responsibility to ensure children are safe and can enjoy their lunch and playtime

You will:

- Receive direction and guidance from the Senior Midday Supervisor and teaching staff on the needs of the pupils and apply them during the midday break
- Encourage children to play co-operative games
- Ensure that all health and safety practices and procedures affecting children are maintained
- Ensure that injuries to children are dealt with effectively and that the correct procedures are followed
- Support positive pupil behaviour and follow the school's procedures in dealing with any problems
- Remain in the playground until all the children have returned to their classes at the end of the midday break
- Attend training as required

Duties in the Dinner Hall

- Encourage children to make healthy choices
- Monitor what children are eating and alert the Senior Midday Supervisor if there are problems
- Keep the dining hall clean and tidy
- Help to maintain a calm and welcoming environment

Professional conduct and safeguarding

- The school expects staff to set a good example to pupils through their own conduct and behaviour by ensuring they maintain high standards of professionalism and maintain appropriate boundaries
- The code of conduct agreement on appointment sets out the school's expectations with regards to standards of professional behaviour
- Staff must ensure they are aware and comply with school policies and procedures with regards to child protection and safeguarding
- All staff have a legal duty to raise concerns where they feel individuals are failing to safeguard and promote the welfare of children. (See whistle blowing policy)
