

Patricia and Francisco Reis have recently moved to the UK from Brazil with their children Mariana, eight and Gabriel, six.

Researching options

Neither Mariana nor Gabriel spoke any English. Patricia says: "now that the children are happily enrolled there, we believe it's not likely that any other school could have been more supportive in every way and we are very, very happy with our choice."

Rewarded

Aside from encouraging children's academic achievement, King's Hedges overall approach is, believes Patricia, a very positive one. "I really like the way the children are respected for their efforts rather than just for their successes. They are praised and rewarded for trying and are motivated to do their best. Both Mariana and Gabriel actively enjoy school, and that is a reflection of the way that King's Hedges Educational Foundation knows how to treat its pupils."

Children say:

Mariana likes everything about King's Hedges but several things stand out for her:"The way we are taught is fun. I like being challenged and that we are rewarded for our work and behaviour. It's nice when we know that our teachers are happy with what we are doing."

Gabriel's comprehension of English is not yet perfect but he is starting to understand more and more."The teachers helped me by using photographs, pictures and demonstrations so that I knew what was going on in class. I am making friends and I enjoy my lessons 5 and the drama after-school club."

Key Stages

The National Curriculum at King's Hedges Educational Federation is divided into three stages:

- I. Early Years Foundation Stage: from ages 0-5
- 2. Key Stage 1: from ages 5-7
- 3. Key Stage 2: from ages 7-11

Nursery

Our nursery takes children from two years of age. All children in will be linked to a key worker who is responsible for ensuring that children's records are kept up to date and that their general well-being is managed. However all children will work with all staff in nursery.

The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum is based on seven areas of learning:

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

Independent thinking

Tracey is also a fan of the Home Learning initiative, where the children can opt to undertake a different project each term.

"All my children have really enjoyed doing this and even though it's not compulsory they mostly finish every project. I think it is such a good way to encourage them to learn; rather than just being given facts, they are finding information for themselves and thinking independently. Having to write up what they have learned is also a good exercise in literacy, as they have to get the spelling right!"

Curriculum



Enriched curriculum: trips and events

The curriculum is further enhanced by the introduction of trips and events. For example, every September, Years 5 and 6 go on a residential trip to a farm... where they have great fun getting into everyday life as a farmer. We have also previously held a "Victorian Wash Day" and a week long "Pompeii/Herculaneum" experience, which brings subjects alive for children and encompasses what they have learnt in the classroom.

Art Exhibitions

A yearly art exhibition is held, displaying childrens' art and stakeholders and local members of the community are invited to view the exhibition.

Behaviour

Good behaviour is encouraged and maintained through good interpersonal relationships, which are based on a

knowledge and understanding of individual children and their needs. The emphasis is on positive encouragement, stimulation and a sense of purpose.

School Council

Children from Year I-Year 6 are elected onto the School Council by their class. The School Council includes a representative from each class and ensures that children's opinions are heard and valued.

The School Council recently raised over £220 for Comic Relief by holding a giant cake sale... and are particularly interested in the 'Safer Routes to School' project.

"I cannot fault the effort put in for children who need it at an early age." Kirsty wanted to make sure her sons' different needs were met appropriately, and King's Hedges Educational Federation has been able to do that and more.

Kirsty and Bryan Cooke live in North Cambridge with their sons Joshua, six and Adam, four.

Good reports

Kirsty and Bryan were keen to secure a place at King's Hedges Educational Federation for Joshua as it incorporates a Nursery."We felt that it would be much better for Joshua to start school with friends he had already made through Nursery and I had heard good reports from other people about King's Hedges," says Kirsty.

Improving confidence

King's Hedges runs a programme called So To Speak,

designed to give extra encouragement to children who may lack confidence in some aspects of their learning. Kirsty believes that it was So To Speak which made Joshua's transition to Reception much smoother than it might otherwise have been. "I think he would have found it much harder to go into Reception from Nursery had he not had this extra boost," she says. "The classes were smaller with a higher teacher to pupil ratio and Joshua responded very well. The school realises the importance of transition stages and that some children need more help than others which makes me more certain than ever that this was the right place for our children."

Adam is also benefitting from So To Speak, although for different reasons. Born with meningitis, he needed

help with his speech and language skills which had been affected by his illness. "Again, the attention he received was wonderful and he came on a great deal in a short time," Kirsty says. "I cannot fault the effort put in for children who need it at an early age, making sure they are able to keep up when they move to the next year group."

Children say:

Joshua says: "I like number work and ERR and playing with my friends. I like playing games especially Pop up Pirate in the Group Room and my teachers are nice and I like doing my work."

Adam says: "I like snack time and playing outside with my friends and singing."

Inclusion: a curriculum for all

Children with special needs

We modify the curriculum where needed to ensure that all child can access education. Where appropriate a referral to an external agency may be arranged. Children may be added to the Special Education Needs Register, and an Individual Education Plan (IEP) written to help them reach their potential. The IEP will be shared with parents twice yearly during parent/teacher meetings.

Access

Children with a physical disability are fully supported in accessing all parts of the school and the curriculum.

Academically more able children

It is very important that children who are seen as academically more able have their needs recognised and are given an appropriate and differentiated curriculum, or skill set. Once identified, academically more able pupils will be added to the Academically More Able Register. This register helps the school track pupil progress to ensure successful progression through school. Emma believes that the understanding and support from King's Hedges Educational Federation have helped her son more than any other school might have done.



"If not for the school's support we would have found it hard to know where to begin." Emma and Chris Appleby live in Cambridge where their three children are all enrolled at King's Hedges Educational Federation. Thomas is ten, Lily, six and Molly is four years old.

Additional support

As Lily is doing very well indeed in her studies, and even little Molly is starting to be able to read and write, Emma's only concern has been for Thomas. "They suggested that he should be assessed to find out what the problem might be and arranged for this to be done. Eventually, it was shown that he has dyslexia, speech and language delay and short-term memory loss and that, although he was able to cope with mainstream education, he would need additional support."

Grateful

This was the beginning of a lengthy and sometimes frustrating process but the school helped Emma and Chris greatly through the business of obtaining a Statement of Special Educational Needs (SEN) for Thomas so that he would benefit from one-to-one classroom support when necessary. "If not for the school's support we would have found it hard to know where to begin. Apart from the fact that it was distressing for us to know that Thomas had these problems we also had to deal with the practicalities and I was so grateful that King's Hedges knew how to go about it all."

Rachal's son was a school refuser, but King's Hedges Educational Federation refused to give up on him.

"His tests results have definitely improved and he often gets marks of 80% to 100%." Rachal Creek lives in North Cambridge with her three children, Rhys, Ben and Jay. Ben and Jay have both been to King's Hedges School where Jay is currently in his final year.

"Even from nursery, Jay has disliked school and has tried anything he can to avoid going," says Rachel. "Whatever the reason might be, sometimes it has been really difficult to persuade him into school in the mornings and I can only feel grateful that King's Hedges has been very sympathetic and understanding." Jay likes the after-school clubs

"He excels at physical activities and has made full use of the school's after-school clubs such as cricket and music and he plays football for the school team."

Accelerated Reading programme get results

The school now uses an Accelerated Reading programme. "Jay gets support with this from the Headteacher who spends time with him each day. Treating Jay as a person in his own right, and having much more empathy and understanding of his individual needs, has really helped his experience at school. His tests results have definitely improved and he often gets marks of 80% to 100%, so this programme works very well for Jay." **Children say:**
