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Introduction

The Boarding Schools' Association (BSA) is the largest association for boarding schools in the world, with over 500 members in more than 20 countries.

Director of Training and International

Key responsibilities:

- Plan and co-deliver training for boarding staff overseas
- Secure and deliver consultancy and inspection projects in the UK and overseas
- Manage BSA Training and International Team and associated staff
- Contribute to the running of BSA through the BSA Leadership Team.
