Job Purpose

- To carry out duties of a school teacher as set out in the current Schoolteachers' Pay and Conditions Document.
- To carry out the duties of a Classroom Teacher in line with this Job Description.
- To undertake Spanish teaching under the direction of the Lead Teacher and to participate in the development and organisation of the wider Department in common with all members of the Department.
- To carry out particular duties that the Headteacher may reasonably direct as needs arise.

To achieve this the Postholder will:

- Teach Spanish as required at all levels.
- Maintain records of achievement and progress of all pupils in accordance with the statutory requirements and the departmental policy.
- Contribute to the Department's bank of resources for the teaching of Spanish and assist in the production of materials which take into account pupils of all abilities and levels.
- Contribute to the drawing up, evaluation and reviewing of schemes of work in relation to Key Stages 3, 4 and possibly Key Stage 5
- Plan and evaluate work in accordance with departmental policy.
- Provide team teaching support in class as required.
- Setting and monitoring homework assignments regularly in accordance with school policy
- To promote good order among pupils and safeguard their health and safety both on and of the school premises.
- To act in accordance with the school's policy on Health and Safety Issues.

The post holder must at all times carry out his/her job responsibility with due regard to the school's Equal Opportunities Policy.
