#### **Admission to Baginton Fields**

It is anticipated that the maximum number of students on roll will be 100 although the actual student place factor is determined on an annual basis by Coventry Education Authority. All the students at Baginton Fields School have Statements of Special Educational Needs or Education, Health and Care Plans issued by the Local Authority. Because of the highly specialised nature of the school, it is not unusual for students to be admitted without the benefit of a formal assessment of Special Educational Need, which has resulted in an Education, Health and Care Plan that actually names Baginton Fields School as the preferred school placement. However, parents of children without such a provision are welcome to visit the school and discuss their child's possible placement.

#### The School Day

The school day is divided into a number of set lessons, with lunchtime activities to which students have access. The school day begins at 9am and finishes at 3.30pm.

#### **Transport**

The City Council provides transport for some students attending Baginton Fields School. Each vehicle has an escort to supervise students on route. **The school is not responsible for student transport arrangements.** Enquiries and concerns regarding school transport should be addressed to Routeforward Travel Bureau (Special Needs Transport) **Telephone: 024 7683 4004.** It is highly likely students resident in neighbouring authorities eg Warwickshire will not be provided home school transport to the school.



#### Communication

#### **School Uniform**

There is an optional school uniform to help students identify with their school. Official school sweatshirt, rugby and polo shirts are available from *Andy Blair Sports and Schoolwear*, Barker Butts Lane, Coventry. Swimwear and PE kit should be sent in to school as determined by your child's timetable. Please ensure that all of your child's clothing and belongings are clearly named.





#### **Student Attendance**

The school is keen to encourage students to attend regularly and seeks the support of parents / carers to ensure students receive a consistent education that is not interrupted by unnecessary absences from school.

Parents are strongly discouraged from organising family holidays during term time but, if it is absolutely necessary, parents must complete a Request for Leave for

Exceptional Reasons form available from school for consideration by the headteacher.

#### **School Meals**

School meals are provided by Solihull City Council Catering Department who employ a cook and kitchen assistants at the school and manage the school menus. Individual diets are catered for on a daily basis as required for ethnic or medical requirements. *Please send school meals payment promptly in a sealed, labelled envelope.* Students may bring a packed lunch. If you are in receipt of income support your child is entitled to a free school meal, please ask the School Office for an application form.

#### **Student Safeguarding and Child Protection**

We apply a consistent school entrance procedure to ensure the safety of all students when on the school site. Visitors, including parents / carers will be accompanied in school unless they have Criminal Record Bureau (CRB) or Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) clearance. Thank you for your patience.

There may be occasions when the school has to consult other agencies without a parent's prior knowledge. Senior members of staff may also wish to contact parents/carers in order to clarify information received in school. The school's first concern is the child's welfare and the school has a duty to protect the child at all times. We follow the Coventry Area Child Protection Committee procedures and a copy of the procedures is available in school.



Our Named Child Protection Officer is Alison Francis, Deputy Headteacher.




#### **Our Curriculum**

Key Stage 3	Students aged 11 – 14 years	Lower School
Key Stage 4	Students aged 14 – 16 years	Middle School
Key Stage 5	Students aged 16 – 19 years	Upper School

#### Students are placed into 1 of 4 teaching groups in each of the 3 Key Stages:

**Group 1 students**. Learning is significantly influenced by Autism. The greater majority of students are boys and the classes numbers are small – 6/7 students taught by 3 or 4 staff. 6 components provide the context to improving interaction and communication:

Communication / Citizenship / Flexibility / Emotional Wellbeing / Independence / Discovery.



Learning is significantly influenced by complex needs. Students are dependent on adults for their care and education. Some students may have medical needs that impact on their access to education. Class groups are small. The curriculum for Group 2 students comprises 6 elements: Communication / Citizenship / Curiosity / Physical Wellbeing / Emotional and Social Wellbeing / Creativity.

#### Group 3 students.

Learning is influenced by severe learning difficulties. Additional needs, such as communication difficulties, may present additional barriers to learning. There will be typically 10/11 students in each group. Differentiated timetable of National Curriculum subjects supported by a Foundation Subjects Themed Curriculum. Teaching by Subject Leaders leading to ASDAN accreditation / English and maths Functional Skills / Work Related Learning / College courses / Building Learning Power.



Learning may be influenced by a range of needs but students demonstrate greater independence and higher attainment than other students in school. There are typically between 9 and 11 students in each group. Curriculum opportunities are similar to Group 3 students.


