- To be forward looking and constantly review, improve and enrich our curriculum to ensure learning is relevant and exciting for all pupils.

Our educational approach

We have high expectations of all our pupils and expect everyone to do their best. Our TOP CLASS initiative rewards the attributes of being a good learner. We encourage our pupils to be resilient learners and take responsibility for their own learning. We personalise provision as much as possible and believe our role is to find a pathway through for all learners. We have adopted aspects of the 'learning without limits' philosophy which challenges the notion of fixed ability and encourages all pupils to work hard and aim high without limits set on what they can achieve. Our teaching focuses on the key skills of reading, writing and mathematics and we provide a broad range of opportunities across the curriculum to apply, develop and consolidate these important life skills.

Our pupils

Buxton Junior School serves a diverse catchment area with a range of pupils from different socio-economic backgrounds. In 2017 over a quarter of pupils were classed as disadvantaged. Whilst Buxton is blessed with beautiful surroundings, access to a broad range of opportunities is limited for many children at the school. Our staff work hard to raise aspirations and we are ambitious for all pupils to fulfil their potential. As a school we involve ourselves with a wide range of enrichment

The majority of our pupils transfer from Buxton Infant School and a higher than average number of pupils arrive with Special Educational Needs or Disabilities. Our Teaching Assistants work with individuals and small groups of pupils to help them develop. Pupils enjoy coming to school and attendance is above the national average.

and cultural opportunities in order to prepare children for life in modern Britain.

Pupils are enthusiastic and active citizens in the school – running clubs and assemblies and engaging in Circle Time in vertical groupings to discuss school improvement. The school works to promote British values and raise awareness of diversity to give children a wider range of experiences than are available in the local area.

We work closely with the Open Centre in Derby and have recently joined the Stockport Area School Linking Project.

The school has ambitious plans to make better use of its unique site and enable greater opportunities to explore learning outside.


Buxton Junior School is located within walking distance of the centre of Buxton on a site that backs on to Grinlow Woods and Solomon's Temple.

The market town of Buxton, Derbyshire has a population of about 25,000 and is located in the heart of the Peak District about an hour's drive from Manchester, Sheffield, Derby and Stoke. World famous for its thermal spa water, architecture and Opera House, it is surrounded by the amazing landscapes of the Peak District National Park. Whilst the town's heritage was built on tourism, Buxton now has a mixed economy including tourism, retail, quarrying, scientific research & light industry.



Our teachers

Our teachers have a range of experience, from three recently qualified teachers to those with many years' experience. Most are full time, but there are job shares in two classes. We have two Specialist Leaders in Education (one in science and one for assessment) as part of the Synergy Teaching School Alliance. One of our maths coordinators has been involved in a research and development project as part of the Alliance. Two of our staff have completed the NPQSL and one has achieved the SENCO qualification. We have two sports coaches who take PE lessons while teachers have their PPA or management release time.



Our culture

Safeguarding remains at the core of all we do at Buxton Junior School and our safeguarding arrangements are highly effective. Our pupils' happiness is a key priority. The school is concerned with the whole child, and seeks to provide holistic care and support through provision of Family Resource Workers and a school counsellor. We are currently fundraising an outdoor learning hub which will provide further potential as a holistic space.

The well-being of staff and pupils is an important ethos of the school and extends to the staff room, with annual massage sessions being provided for staff.

The mindfulness programme that is currently being piloted within year 5 and 6, will hopefully be rolled out to the whole school after it has been evaluated and further training undertaken.

Our parents

We foster good relationships with parents and carers, and most are very supportive of the school. Our Family Resource Workers are a valuable asset in promoting relationships with families. Parents are encouraged to come into school and engage with their children's learning through various activities including reading together, mouthwatering maths and French breakfast. Feedback from parents is sought at all parents' evenings on a 'comments tree' and via topic specific coffee mornings. Some of the comments made at the most recent parents' evenings are shown right;



Our future

Our Governors and staff are highly ambitious for our school and determinedly address areas for improvement. We work with all stakeholders to ensure a shared approach to the school vision. Governors recently ran a Three Year Planning session attended by all staff which discussed amongst other things:

- Encouraging children to perceive themselves as curious learners and take more control of their learning
- Ambitious plans for expansion of outdoor learning and greater community links focused on better using the school.
- Continued team enrichment and professional development of staff
- Exploration of new opportunities to open up communication with parents
- The need to be outward looking and prepared to make the most of collaborating with others
