Founded in 1862, Haileybury is an independent co-educational boarding school which offers a fully-rounded education for boys and girls aged 11 to 18.



Examples of our partnership with Haileybury

- Our Cadets have weekly training with Haileybury Cadets
- Our Year 11 triple scientists have weekly sessions with Haileybury science staff to provide additional specialist teaching in biology, chemistry and physics
- The Head of Spanish from Haileybury is working with some of our Year 11 Spanish students

- Haileybury provides support for Year 13 students applying for medicine, dentistry or veterinary science
- There is a weekly co-curricular climbing club held at Haileybury

Results in 2017

Our Progress 8 score for all Year 11 students in 2017 was -014 with the upper confidence interval above 0. For disadvantaged students it was -0.17 which was a huge improvement compared to 2016. 57% of our students achieved both at least a grade 4 in maths and English, with significantly higher outcomes in both maths and English

individually. We also saw very strong results in a number of other subjects including dance, drama, media, PE and product design.

In the Sixth Form we again achieved very pleasing results continuing the successes we have had over a number of years. We had excellent results in a wide range of A Level subjects including English literature, maths, physics, geography and economics. There was real success across the whole range of vocational subjects offered too with many top grades achieved in business, ICT, health and social care and art. 65% of our Year 13 students chose university or Advanced Level apprenticeships.

Results in 2016

55% of our Year 11 students achieved an A*-C pass in both maths and English, with 81% of all English grades being graded at grade C and above. A significant number of subjects performed very well including Spanish, art, photography, product design, dance and PE.

In our A Level and vocational examinations, 76% of all passes were at A*-B or Distinction*/Distinction. The average grade across all vocational subjects was Distinction* and our student pass rate remained at 100% At A Level, 80% of grades were at grade C or above. These results represent the highest ever achieved with a number of subjects breaking previous records including English Literature and sociology. Students won places at good universities including UCL, Kings and Loughborough as well as higher level apprenticeships at RBS and Ernst & Young.

We are on track to sustain the level of achievement in the Sixth Form this summer, and build further on the improving results in Year 11 achieved over the past two years since becoming a sponsored academy.

Staff Benefits

The school offers all its staff a range of benefits including:

Recruitment Incentives

We will consider giving financial recruitment and retention incentives to outstanding candidates. In addition, the school commits to paying back training fees up to a maximum of £8000 over 4 years for Newly Qualified Teachers who join us.

Professional Development Opportunities

We offer excellent induction and training to support professional development to all teaching and support staff. We have programmes in place for Newly Qualified Teachers as well as aspiring Middle Leaders and Senior Leaders. There are also opportunities to work with teaching and support staff at our sponsor, Haileybury. Support staff are also well catered for with specific training to support individual roles. There will also be additional remunerated action research opportunities from September 2017 to help support our teaching and learning culture in the school. We work with a range of different teacher training providers which gives mentoring opportunities to a number of our staff.
