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Govan High School: School Profile

Govan High School is non-denominational, co-educational, comprehensive school that caters for pupils aged 12-18. The school can trace its history back to 1875, although the name Govan High dates from 1 February 1910. It was raised to the status of a Senior Secondary in 1919. Govan High moved to its present site in 1969 when the present building was opened by Mr Anthony Hepper who was Chairman of Upper Clyde Shipbuilders at that time. The refurbished building was re-opened by Sir Alex Ferguson CBE on 12 September 2002. Sir Alex is a former pupil. The school celebrated its centenary year in 2010.

The roll for 2018-19 is 460 at the time of writing. Most teachers presently have a room for their own exclusive use. Each teaching and base area has a computer with Internet Access. Almost all teaching areas have an interactive whiteboard and a projector.

The Public Private Partnership Initiative in Glasgow has resulted in the school being refurbished and state of the art computer facilities have been provided. In addition to teaching rooms, the school has specialist accommodation. There are 5 computer suites; Art & Design, Home Economics, the Sciences and Technical Education all have special practical areas; Physical Education has 3 gymnasia and a swimming pool; the Pirie Park, adjacent to the school campus has areas for football, hockey and athletics. The Library has been re-modelled and re-launched as a Learning Resource Centre with Careers, Continuous Professional Development, Computer and teaching and research areas.

The teaching staff allocation for 2018-2019 is 41 FTE. The school leadership team consists of the HT, 4 DHTs, and a range of Faculty Heads and Principal Teachers.

The work of the teaching staff is ably complemented by a number of support staff. The school has 2.6 clerical assistants, 3 pupil support assistants, 1.8 technicians and 0.4 librarians. Amey Business Services are the Facilities Managers for the school and they provide 2 janitors and a day cleaner.

Language and Communication Resource

A significant feature of the school is the Language & Communication Resource (LCR). The LCR is a citywide provision to support young people, of secondary school age, who have a range of language and communication needs, related to their Autistic Spectrum Disorder diagnosis. The current LCR role is 33

Although our LCR pupils experience challenges related to their ASD, the majority are academically capable of accessing the secondary curriculum. The curriculum will be the same

as that being offered within Govan High. At Broad General education stage pupils will be taught mainly by LCR staff within the LCR classrooms. All pupils access PE and Science in Govan High School using Govan High School staff, supported by LCR staff. At Senior Phase, students have the additional option of accessing part of their curriculum through school-link or vocational courses at FE Colleges within Glasgow. This is in addition to courses being offered in both Govan High School and the LCR. LCR staff support pupils academically as well as promoting the acquisition of social, organisational and independent living skills. A number of staff are also trained to offer support with mental health, sleep, bereavement and emotional regulation issues.

The LCR Staff is comprised of 1 DHT, 1 PT, 11.8 (FTE) Teachers and 8.7 (FTE) Support for Learning Workers
