The Design & Technology Department

The Design and Technology Department at Framlingham College is nationally recognised and has a reputation for producing work of the highest quality. The Design School building is shared by both the Design and Technology and Art Departments. The Design and Technology suite is spacious and well-resourced having two main workshops, two design studios, a jewellery workshop, an IT/CAD suite, a CNC router table, laser cutter and vinyl cutter. This is maintained by a full time technician who is the fourth member of the Design and Technology team.

Design and Technology is a popular option for both boys and girls at GCSE and A Level. This, we believe, is a result of the philosophy that students are capable of designing and making to a professional standard, which is borne out by the quality of the work produced. Students are encouraged to spend their free time in the department, and as a consequence, out of school activities form a vital part of the department's role within the College. The successful applicant will be expected to be sympathetic to this approach and to encourage the highest possible standards at all times. It is hoped that he/ she will be able to contribute to the majority of courses that the department offers. At present these are:


- Year 9 KS3 Core Design and Technology,
- GCSE KS4 CIE iGCSE Design and Technology
- KS5 PreU Art and Design: Product Design.

We aim to get the best exam results possible with our students but are keen that they develop a real sense of enjoyment and satisfaction in designing and making. They are encouraged to work as though they are commercial designers and as a consequence, they take a responsibility for, and a pride in their work that is well beyond their years. Silversmithing, jewellery, furniture design and engineering feature heavily in their design projects and at the end of every Summer Term an exhibition is held which forms a significant part of the College calendar leading up to Speech Day.

The department has an enviable record of success in a number of national initiatives. Over the years we have had at least 20 students receive an Arkwright Scholarship. The Arkwright Award is the most prestigious national Design and Technology award for students who show aptitude in Design or Engineering and wish to take the subject to advanced level or beyond.

Other notable achievements have included participation in the Young Engineers for Britain, the Engineering Education Scheme and the Audi Young Designer of the Year. In 2011 a Sixth Form student won the Tibbenham Award, presented by the Institute of Cast Metal Engineers. In addition to regional success in these competitions our students have been national finalists three times in the Young Engineers for Britain and twice in the Audi Young Designer of the Year.

In addition to enjoying teaching and an enthusiasm for designing and making there will need to be a willingness to contribute to other areas of College life; both through activities affiliated to the department and in the wider curriculum; for example we maintain a good working relationship with the Art Department and the Theatre; helping with the props and set for major productions.

Our Location

The Framlingham College campus sits at the heart of the beautiful, vibrant yet historic market town of Framlingham, in Suffolk.

The town, which pre-dates its mention in the Domesday Book of 1086, is perhaps most famous for its castle. This magnificent monument occupies a hill on one side of the town's mere, while our own campus tops the rise opposite.

On Tuesdays and Saturdays, the town centre hosts a busy market selling food and drinks, gifts and collectibles. Framlingham boasts a range of independent shops, covering practically every need, while the numerous eating places and pubs cater to almost every taste.

Just a few miles from Suffolk's Heritage Coast – embracing Aldeburgh and Southwold, amongst many other seaside locations – Framlingham is about 35 minutes by car from the county town of Ipswich, 40 minutes from Bury St Edmunds in the west of the county and an hour from the city of Norwich in Norfolk.

There are regular trains from Ipswich to London's Liverpool Street station. London Stansted Airport and Norwich Airport are each just over an hour's drive away from Framlingham.

Framlingham College Prep School - also home to the Nursery - is in the nearby village of Brandeston, approximately three miles from Framlingham.
