I am delighted to inform you that their dedicated hours of training paid off as our swimmers came in fifth place in the mixed-stroke relay event and in third place for the Freestyle relay event. They were cheered on by our supportive group of parents who had travelled to the county town of Surrey for this event. This fantastic result means that our swim squad will be competing for the fourth year in a row at the English Schools Relay National Finals in Sheffield in June; as they qualified, by a nail-biting one hundredth of a second, for the Freestyle relay event. Such an amazing achievement!

Mathematicians from Year 4 competed at Christ's Hospital last week in a pairs Maths challenge. Both pairs competed well with Kit and Sam coming a highly impressive second place. Well done to you all!

Going on school trips and visits gives the children many enrichment opportunities to learn away from the classroom. Years 5 and 6 went on their annual residential trip last Tuesday for a week of exploring the sights of Bath and Bristol. 
Zoo Day! - Year 1

Bertie Fencing into the Championships

On Monday 7th May Bertie Lambert (Year 9) fenced as one of the team of six representing the U14 South East Region at the British Youth Championship in Sheffield.

This competition pits the best youth fencers in the country against one another following a regional competition in February at which both Bertie and William Ashenden (Year 11) qualified; unfortunately due to imminent GCSEs William was unable to compete at the national championship. Bertie fenced very well against fierce competition and although he finished 3rd within his region, sadly the South East Region U14 did not bring home any medals this time. Bertie is now training hard for the England Youth Championship in June.

Jemimah had quite an astonishing 1st day, competing in the 200m Individual Medley. She went in ranked seventh in the Age 14 category and swam a brilliant personal best in the heats to take her through to the Finals ranked 2nd. She stepped up in the Final and shattered her entry time producing a magnificent personal best time of 2.27.43, taking Gold and becoming SE Regional Champion and qualifying for the British Championships in July in addition to her three breast stroke events where she is already aualified and ranked first in Britain. She swam her favourite 50m breast stroke breaking her own Age 14 South East Record in 32.44s and taking Gold and the Regional Champion title again. Jemimah has also set a new Kent Junior (16U) record time.

BAS Biologists get stuck into practical activities

Our fantastic Battle Abbey A Level Biologists, love practical activities. These are underpinned by the theoretical concepts they are required to learn as they develop and apply their biological understanding. Along with the other Year 12 Biologists, Thomas enjoyed the challenge of studying the gas exchange system of a mackerel. With aspirations to study medicine, Thomas, along with the other students, demonstrated the consummate skill of a potential surgeon to remove the gill operculum to reveal the gill filaments beneath.

As part of studying gene technology, the brilliant Year 13 Biologists were set the task of using a technique called electrophoresis to analyse samples of DNA taken from the "scene of a crime". This produced genetic fingerprint





"barcodes" that enabled comparison with samples from "suspects" to determine "Who dun it?". Despite being their first attempt, this amazing group of young biologists were able to produce and load their own gels to produce excellent genetic fingerprints. With aspirations to study Biomedical Science, Millie can be seen examining the genetic fingerprint she produced. The inset shows the genetic fingerprints that reveals the guilty criminal whose DNA was found at the "scene of the crime" is B!







