Laurence Jackson, a school to be proud of at the heart of the community. A place where everyone is valued and learning in cherished in a safe, caring and supportive environment.



Curriculum Provision

Students at Laurence Jackson access a broad and diverse curriculum that enables all students to make the best of their talents, whilst acquiring the skills and knowledge to succeed in the wider world.

Key Stage 3

On arrival in the school each placed student is appropriate year group and house. Within a year group each student is allocated into a mixed ability form. In Year 7, students are taught in mixed ability forms for some subjects but are set in others, such as the core subjects. Most departments decide to set students during their first year as a result of their own internal assessments. At the end of each year students are assessed by their teachers in each of the subjects studied.

Improving life chances

Key Stage 4

There have been significant curriculum changes over the past few years and these changes will continue until 2018. The Core subjects: English, Maths and Science, along with the English Baccalaureate subjects History, Geography and MFL have been delivering the new curriculum to our KS4 students.

From September 2017, other subjects commence their new curriculum with their first exams being taken in 2019.

As a result of these new curriculum changes and the greater curriculum content within these subjects we have commenced the KS4 curriculum for some subjects in Year 9. These include English, Mathematics, Science, GCSE MFL French & Spanish and Business & Communication Systems. All other options subjects commence in Year 10 and follow a two year syllabus.

Options currently follow a Pathway route, to fulfil every child's potential, whilst conforming to the Government's National Curriculum requirements.

Additional Curriculum Information

Careers Education Information and Guidance

The school aims to give all our students an awareness of the education, training and careers opportunities available to them Post 16. Our comprehensive Careers Education Information and Guidance programme includes talks, visits, videos, college taster courses, use of a computer database, action planning, individual vocational guidance interviews, a making opportunities programme, an annual careers convention and a full week's work experience.

Laurence Jackson has recently been awarded the coveted "Investors in Careers" status. CEIAG provision is provided by our Routes to Employment dedicated careers advisors who provide up to date, impartial careers advice to students.

Business and Enterprise Links

The school has, through its specialism, supported by other curriculum areas, developed extensive links with local businesses. Throughout their school life students are encouraged to develop their enterprise skills. These skills are developed through a number of different activities such as work experience, taking part in enterprise activities, working towards the Duke of Edinburgh Award, participating in a school team, getting a part time job, or organising an event or trip.



Home Learning

At Laurence Jackson we believe that all students should develop skills as independent learners. Home study plays an important part in the development of this skill and is essential if students are to achieve maximum success in their work. Students are expected to take responsibility for their learning and read around their subjects. The Headteacher's Challenge, various apps and websites are available for extension work.



Progress Checks

For parents, we aim to encourage full involvement in the life of the school and provide a range of information so as to encourage improved understanding and closer liaison between home and school.

Throughout the school year parents are kept informed of their son/daughter's progress. Progress Checks are issued at set times throughout the year and help to inform parents of their child's progress, effort and behaviour.


LJS has achieved a huge array of positive accolades centred around our Sports College Specialism.

The Sports College also boasts an extensive lunchtime and after-school club timetable and competitive fixtures delivered by PE staff and external coaches.

Care and Support at Laurence Jackson School

The times above include five 1 hour teaching periods, a mid-morning break, lunch period and a tutorial session.
