Boys begin Latin in Year 6 following CLC and then move on to follow the ISEB CE Latin syllabus drawing upon the 'Latin Practice Exercises' series of textbooks which were written by Bob Bass (published by Galore Park) specifically for the syllabus for Common Entrance exams for entry into senior schools at 13+. The successful applicant will assume responsibility for the department, with autonomy over the Latin curriculum in this well resourced department.

Experience of Common Entrance and Public School scholarship exams would be an advantage but not essential. Applicants should also be at ease with using ICT as part of the Latin curriculum and should be enthusiastic about the teaching possibilities of interactive whiteboards and iPads.
