
St Hilda's Church of England (VA) Primary School, Headteacher Candidate Information January 2018





About Us

St Hilda's Church of England Primary School Firswood is a 1½ form entry school, with over 310 pupils (+ 26 FTE nursery). We believe the school is truly representative of the local community; we are highly diverse in intake with the rare quality of having a roughly equal proportion of white, Asian and black heritage children. The socio-economic mix is just as diverse and similarly balanced. We prize this diversity, just as we prize the varied faith traditions that come together within the Christian ethos of our church school.

In 2014 we were judged to be a 'Good' school by Ofsted and both pupils and teachers have continued to strive for excellence in all aspects.

Ofsted said:

- The behaviour and safety of the pupils is judged to be outstanding.
- The teaching is mostly good and some teaching is outstanding.
- Pupils achieve well and reach above average standards in reading, writing and mathematics by the end of Y6.
- Pupils who start school with little or no English achieve well because of the very effective support provided for them.

As a Church of England school, St Hilda's is also inspected under SIAMS. St. Hilda's was last inspected in March 2013 and was judged to be a good school. The inspector concluded:

- The effectiveness of the leadership and management of the school is outstanding.
- The school, through its distinctive Christian character, is outstanding in meeting the needs of all learners.
- The effectiveness of the religious education is good.
- The impact of collective worship on the school community is good.
