

JOB DESCRIPTION

Job Title: Science Teacher

Responsible to: Head of Department/Deputy Head of Academic

Hours of work:

This is a fulltime position, term time 34 weeks, with additional days for inset/training days outside of this period. There is also an allocation of one evening duty a week during term time.

The Role

We are looking for an enthusiastic and committed teacher, with a passion for learning, a talented communicator who has the ability to bring out the potential of young people.

The post holder will be qualified and be able to deliver a balanced, relevant and differentiated curriculum to students in Science; to support subject developments; to monitor, assess and report upon student progress, and to contribute to raising subject standards within the department and the school.

Main Duties:

- To prepare for and undertake the teaching of science from Key Stage 2 to Key Stage 5.
- To contribute and create departmental schemes of work.
- To communicate with the Science Technician to ensure all equipment for classroom experiments is coordinated in advance.
- To ensure all students work is marked in accordance with the schools marking policy.
- To keep full records of attendance and achievement/progress of all pupils taught including formative and summative assessment
- To make sure that the classroom is a welcoming learning environment and create displays in the department and your classroom.
- To ensure individual needs are met through appropriate use of differentiation.
- To analyse student data, identify vulnerable groups and implement intervention strategies.
- To incorporate numeracy, literacy, British values and IT across the curriculum.

Liaison:

- Organise GCSE, A Level and other examination entries with the Head of Department.
- To liase with the Head of Department in all matters concerned with the timetable and curriculum.
- To communicate with parents, house staff and other relevant staff for all aspects of student progress and reports.



Publicity:

- Promote and publicise the work and achievements of the department through the Head of Department.
- To promote the subject within the school by coordinating, now and then, special events for children, parents or both. The display of subject work within the school.

Health and Safety:

- Carry out risk assessments in line with the school's Health and Safety policy.
- Oversee arrangements for the safety of pupils and staff in school and on visits and excursions.

Other Responsibilities:

Any other duties negotiated with the Headteacher and Head of Department.

Additional Responsibilities:

- Carry out the duties of a Form Tutor, as required
- Carry out the duties of a Subject Teacher.
- Carry out a share of supervisory duties in accordance with published schedules.

Generic Accountabilities:

The duties outlined above are not intended as a restrictive list and may be extended or altered to include other tasks that are commensurate with the role.
