

Information about our School

Bishop Ullathorne Catholic School is a voluntary-aided school situated in a very pleasant residential area about three miles south of the centre of Coventry, adjacent to the Coventry – Kenilworth Road (A429). In January 2016, Ofsted judged that our school continues to be good and the Diocese Inspection Report in January 2011 said that our school was outstanding. The Local Education Authority judge our school as a 'light touch' school in terms of support needs.

Here at Bishop Ullathorne School, our vision of Catholic education is of educating the whole person to the fullness of life. Our school vision embodies inclusivity but goes further in identifying three key themes that crystallise this: our sense of calling to be someone special, living life to the full and love and service.



We are a truly comprehensive school that serves a very wide area of Coventry, including the most advantaged and disadvantaged wards in the city. Our 961 students are drawn mainly from six parishes and partner primary schools. 90% of all students rely on the school buses, therefore, our students are a very heterogeneous community; whose needs, aspirations and life experiences reflect

the diversity of the city we serve. We work closely with our six partner primary schools in our cluster partnership.



At KS4, all key measures over the past three years show good progress and the majority show outstanding progress. There is no progress below national averages for any student group. At KS5 success rates, retention rates and achievement rates exceed national. This places us first in the city for A-Level.





The Physical Education Department

Our Physical Education Department is a successful and committed team who work well together to provide high standards, varied curriculum opportunities for all students and an extensive programme of sporting competitions. Our Department is highly respected, both within the school and within Coventry.

The team of 4 full time teaching staff combine experience and youth to generate an enthusiastic group who enjoy working together and sharing good practice.

There are two GCSE PE groups in both Year 10 and Year 11 and an A Level group.

Our school is set within 43 acres of beautiful grounds. We have:

- 6 football pitches
- 1 rugby pitch
- 10 tennis courts
- 2 gyms
- 2 halls

Job Description

- To successfully teach P.E. according to the requirements of the National Curriculum and the needs of individual students at Key Stages 3 and 4.
- To deliver the curriculum to the maximum benefit of all students by adopting a variety of teaching and learning strategies.
- To maintain a classroom environment which values the contribution of all students, recognising and publicising success by whichever means it may be measured.

- To maintain and update records of students' progress, including preparation of formal reports, as required.
- To participate in departmental and whole-school activities and events as directed by the Subject Leader and the Head of School.
