Examination Results

All students follow the GCSE Religious Studies course, with many taking the exam. The RS GCSE results for the last four years are:-

GCSE Sociology is a new course with the first cohort completing their exams in 2018.

Time Allocation

The school operates a 30-period weekly timetable.

In Years 7-9, all students have with one lesson each of Religious Studies and PSHCE.

In Year 10, GCSE Sociology and GCSE RS have three lessons per week each as options, while PSHCE has one lesson a week.

In Year 11, GCSE Sociology has three lessons per week as an option, while PSHCE and RS have one lesson a week.

GCSE curriculum

The GCSE RS course currently follows the AQA GCSE RS (A) focusing on Christianity, Islam, Peace and Conflict, Relationships and Families, Crime and Punishment, and Human Rights and Social Justice.

The GCSE Sociology course currently follows the Eduqas syllabus looking at key concepts and processes of cultural transmission, families, education, sociological research methods, social differentiation and stratification, crime and deviance and applied methods of sociological enquiry.
