Teacher of Computer Studies September 2018

This is a new and exciting post for the school.

Computing at LRGS has been running at GCSE and A-level for one year and has been very popular. Time allocation at KS3 is increasing too. As such we need to recruit a teacher of Computer Studies to join this growing department which currently consists only of a head of department. In addition, there may be an opportunity to gain experience of teaching some KS3 mathematics for the right candidate but this is not an essential requirement.

The successful applicant will have a genuine interest in the field of Computing and will be able to transmit that enthusiasm to students. It is desirable that the candidate hold a Computing qualification or alternatively has experience either in industry or in teaching of the subject, such that the candidate could deliver parts of the A-level course.

At GCSE students sit the OCR GCSE course whilst at A-level we use the AQA A-level course. At KS3, students cover topics such as programming, algorithms and cryptography.

The Python programming language is used for much of our formal programming teaching, however students are encouraged to investigate other languages as they progress into A-level. At KS3, our syllabus is strongly weighted toward Computing rather than ICT. There is a Raspberry Pi for every workstation in the lab.

The post would be suitable for either an NQT or a more experienced teacher.

All staff are encouraged to make an additional contribution to the life of the school depending on their interests and inclinations. Possible areas include clubs and societies, sport, outdoor activities, Combined Cadet Force, drama and music.

There may be the opportunity to assist with the boarding houses either supervising pupils during an evening or living in as a Resident Tutor. For boarding responsibilities, a separate allowance is provided.

The successful candidate will need to:

- work as part of a new and expanding department
- motivate and inspire students such that they realise their potential in this subject
- assist in the authoring of course material to support students learning
- plan lessons that are exiting and engaging
- manage behaviour within the classroom and beyond
- be able to maintain and evidence records of pupil progress and communicate this to others in a timely and accurate manner
- show commitment to further raising standards
- be able to adapt to changes in curriculum both at a school level and national level.
