guidance to achieve their very best.


We are proud to be an inclusive school, breaking down barriers and obstacles in a supportive and caring community.



Wellbeing and Safety

- Respect for each other and self respect are central to Academy life. In partnership with parents and carers, we actively promote self-discipline based on an awareness of one's rights and duties as a citizen.
- Good order in classrooms and throughout the Academy is essential for successful teaching and learning. All teachers are encouraged to maintain firm but fair discipline inside and out of lessons.
- Students, and their parents or carers, are required to sign a Home/Academy Agreement. This sets out the partnership between student, parents/carers and the Academy. It is fundamental to shared success here at Francis Combe Academy.
- We recognise our role in safeguarding the welfare of children. We have a comprehensive child protection policy that places the welfare of children at the centre of all our activities. A copy is available on request.

Admissions information and how we consider applications

Francis Combe Academy caters for students from 11 to 19 years of age. The published admission number is 210.

The Academy Trust considers all applications for places at the Francis Combe Academy.

Where fewer than the published admission number(s) for relevant year groups are received, the Academy Trust will offer places to everyone who has applied.

Procedures when Francis Combe Academy Admissions to Year 7 is oversubscribed

Where the number of applications is greater than the published admission number, applications will be considered against the following criteria (and in the order of priority shown here):

- 1. Students with Statements of Special Educational Needs where Francis Combe Academy is named on the statement
- 2. Children who are and have been in public care
- 3. Students with siblings currently attending the Academy and who will continue to do so on the date of admission
- 4. Proximity to the Academy. The distance from an applicant's home to the Academy is measured from the address point for the house (as supplied by the post office) to the nearest public entrance of the Academy, by the 'shortest designated route'. All distances are measured by Hertfordshire County Council (HCC) using a computerised mapping system.

Academy information

Uniform

- At Francis Combe Academy we regard personal appearance very highly. We require all students to look neat and smart as this sets the tone for the high standards of behaviour we expect.
- Co-operation and support with this from parents and carers is essential and much appreciated.
- A copy of the Academy Uniform List is available on request. Much of the uniform is available from any local shop or supermarket retailer, with only a few items needing to be bought direct from the Academy's supplier.

Assemblies and religious education

- All students attend two formal assemblies each week. At other times they meet in tutor rooms for SMART time.
- Religious education is a compulsory separate subject for all Academy students. Details of the curriculum are available on request. It is hoped that all students will attend assemblies and religious education lessons. Parents and carers who would prefer their child not to attend should write to the Academy Principal.

Meeting the needs of all our students

- All students are entitled to equality of educational opportunity, irrespective of social circumstances, gender, ethnicity or ability (which in this case is used in the widest sense to include young people with special educational needs through to students who have particular needs because they are gifted and talented).
- Students on the Special Educational Needs (SEN) register receive in-class support and guidance from learning support assistants, plus additional focus sessions in the Learning Support Base.
- The Academy's SEN Policy aims to ensure students can access an appropriate curriculum which goes beyond the National Curriculum entitlement and prepares them fully for responsible independence in the adult world.
- High ability students are stretched and stimulated at Francis Combe Academy. Our system of 'setting' means we can target appropriate levels of learning and developing for different ability groups, with the top 25 per cent of students being involved in advanced learning to enhance and widen their learning experience.
- Underpinning this attention to special educational needs and support for high achieving students is a commitment to personalise the focus and objectives of learning for all Francis Combe Academy students.

Transport

- We are committed to helping everyone travel safely to and from Francis Combe Academy. We encourage everyone here to consider the environment when travelling and to consider our immediate neighbours when arriving and leaving.
- The Academy's Transport Plan discourages car travel because of the congestion it contributes to. There is very limited parking local to the Academy.
- Parents and carers are asked not to drive onto the Academy site to drop off or collect their children.
- Bicycle storage is available, but we cannot accept any responsibility for the safekeeping of bikes on site.

All parents are encouraged to support the Francis Combe Academy Parent Partners Group, which aims to:

- Develop and maintain good relationships between parents and staff.
- Raise funds for buying extra equipment for students.
- Provide services for students.
- Organise social functions.
