The EUTC was opened in September 2013, as a comprehensive 14-19 college, to provide specialist education within the creative media arts. The college aims to create an environment in which our students can achieve their maximum potential. Approximately 200 are aged 14 - 16 with the rest being part of our sixth form. The successful candidate will be directly involved in envisioning and implementing a programme of powerful support for 14 - 19 year old students who face barriers to their learning (such as those who are disadvantaged or have learning needs).

Working directly with our SENDCo, and assistant principal for behaviour and safety, and other experienced teaching professionals providing support and guidance, your role will be to:


- implement personalised learning programmes with individual students / groups in or outside lessons

- co-tutor a form group and contribute towards enrichment and extra-curricular provision


person specification
