Established in 2014, HELP International School (HIS) is located on the outskirts of Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. The school is an all-through school catering for students from age 3 to 18 through the International Early Years Curriculum (IEYC), International Primary Curriculum (IPC), International Middle Years Curriculum (IMYC), The National Curriculum for England, International GCSE and A Level. The school delivers Singapore Maths in the Primary school and has a vibrant Mandarin programme at all levels that includes assessment using the Chinese Proficiency Test - the HSK.

HIS is a thriving, multicultural learning community representing 25 different nationalities. 85% of students and 65% of staff are Malaysian and the school has achieved a top 'five star' rating in a recent 'SKIPS' inspection by the Ministry of Education. The school is a member of the Association of Malaysian International School's (AIMS) and is currently planning for inspection from Fieldwork Education for the IPC curriculum. We invest in people and offer an extensive professional learning programme to our teachers, equivalent to two hours of professional learning per week. The school is a Professional Development Centre for Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE). Parents are regularly engaged through information workshops and hands-on experiences.
