Curriculum information:

KEY STAGE 3:

Students in year 7, 8 and 9 are timetabled on a carousel system which enables them to rotate around a cycle of different specialisms within the creative curriculum. Students follow our bespoke 'mastery curriculum' and are given opportunities to explore a broad range of practical skills through completing modules in art, drama, and music.

KEY STAGE 4

Students in year 10 and 11 are provided with a wealth of choices to pursue within the Department. In September 2017 the following subjects are running: GCSE Fine Art, GCSE Drama, GCSE Music, GCSE Art (specialising in Photography and Graphics),

KEY STAGE 5

A healthy number of students choose to remain with Abbeyfield School in the Sixth Form, many of which opt for courses within the Creative Department. In September 2017 the following courses will be running: A-Level Fine Art. A-Level Art & Design, Art, BTEC L3 Performing Arts, A-Level Music and A-Level Photography.
