Check equipment and materials before and after class use for quantity and damage. Where required assist staff with class practical work. Clean glassware and other equipment. Construction and repair of equipment. Preparation of chemical solutions. Setting up of demonstration experiments.

Assist teachers with maintenance of science notice boards, mounting of display materials such as visual aids and pupils' work Assist with duplicating and photocopying, filing of worksheets, textbooks and any other documentation.
