



## FURTHER PARTICULARS OF POST OF Teacher of RE w.e.f.April/September 2018

## Introduction

A full-time teacher of RE is required from April/September2018 to be part of a committed and collaborative team who are a key part of a strong Humanities Faculty. The successful applicant will be required to teach RE across the ability range from Years 7-13 including Philosophy at A Level, and RE GCSE. They will also be required to fulfil the role of Group Tutor, teaching PHSCE to their group once a week.

## The Department

In Year 7 and 8 RE is taught as a discrete subject along with Geography and History. RE GCSE (AQA) is an optional subject which is a three year course starting in Year 9. Philosophy A Level (AQA) is offered to our Post 16 students and is a popular course.

The RE Department consists of three specialist teachers. There are dedicated rooms within the Humanities faculty each with an interactive whiteboard. There is also access to laptops across the faculty with a laptop trolley in most rooms for student use.

As a department, we feel strongly that the sharing of good practice is at the heart of our continued success. We meet regularly and work together closely to develop teaching and learning within the subject. All colleagues make a significant contribution, having the opportunity to formulate policy, offer ideas, share good practice and risk-take in a supportive environment. The successful applicant should be able to teach RE and Philosophy with energy and enthusiasm and be an excellent role model.
