

Gatton Hall

Gatton Hall itself is a mansion in the Palladium Style offering magnificent views of the 250 acres of the grounds of the School. The boarding accommodation is on the top two floors of this mansion. It has recently been refurbished and offers first class accommodation to the boarders. As a co-educational house, which is sixth form only, it is a unique boarding house in the school and serves to prepare the pupils extremely well for their next stage.



The house once belonged to Jeremiah Colman, of mustard fame, and has views of the Gatton parkland designed by 'Capability' Brown as his first commercial works. The pupils who board here are extremely fortunate to be able to look onto such.





The boarding house is home to 47 sixth formers. It has a full kitchen for boarders to use, several common rooms, a games room, a laundry and a well-equipped study room.

There is Wifi throughout the house for pupils to use their own devices through the school system, as well as a suite of desktop PC's.

There is accommodation within Gatton Hall for the Head of House and then separately two other flats for resident tutors, thereby allowing the on-call rota to be effectively spread out amongst the team.

Resident staff and their families are welcome to use the Gatton Park grounds and the campus facilities, such as gym, swimming pool, etc.
