## Note from Alison Colenso, Headteacher, Deer Park School

#### March, 2018

Dear Candidate,

Thank you for requesting information regarding the appointment of our very first teacher for Year 3. We are looking for a dedicated and passionate person to join our small but wonderful staff team at Deer Park School and continue with us in the journey of developing what will be a truly outstanding school.

Our school opened in September 2015 through the Government's Free Schools initiative and provides high-quality education for primary school children predominantly in the East Twickenham and St Margaret's areas of Richmond upon Thames.

Deer Park School is part of Bellevue Place Education Trust (BPET), which was established in 2012, with a shared vision for high-quality education, formed by Bellevue Education Group and Place Group. Bellevue Education Group was formed in 2002 and consists of eleven successful independent schools in the UK and two Swiss boarding schools. Place Group Limited is a successful schools' services provider and education consultancy, which was formed coincidentally in 2002.

The close collaboration of Bellevue and Place is a major strength for the Trust, as all schools in the Trust take advantage of the skills and expertise within the two founding partner organisations. For example, through joint CPD with local Bellevue schools and access to Place Group's education consultancy. As a BPET school, we are not alone, but part of a strong and growing network of partner schools: something which we believe will help to drive up standards and provide valuable support to staff.

In September 2013, the Trust successfully opened a two form-entry primary school in Balham: Rutherford House School opened with two Reception classes and will add reception classes each year until reaching capacity.

The opening of Braywick Court School in Bray, and also Whitehall Park School in Islington, in September 2014 marked the next step of the Trust's expansion. Four further schools opened in September 2015: Kilburn Grange School (Kilburn), Halley House School (Dalston), Watling Park School (Barnet) and Deer Park School (Richmond).

I hope you find the information in this short document useful and I look forward to meeting you.
