St Wilfrid's Catholic School Science Department



Our Science Department is lively, friendly and hardworking leading to excellent results. In 2017, 74% of Year 11 students achieve A*-C grades in two GCSE Science qualifications, with 84% of students achieving A*-C in Additional Science; an achievement which places the department in the top 4% nationally for progress.

St Wilfrid's use an enquiry based approach to the subject that, in addition to fuelling a passion to understanding scientific phenomena, encourages students to think for themselves, to ask questions, to form their own conclusions and evaluate evidence presented to them. There is also a strong support team of three technicians. There are six laboratories; all have interactive white boards and excellent facilities for practical Science.

Key Stage 3

Our theme based Science course aims to provide the foundations for understanding the world through the disciplines of Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Students are taught the essential aspects of the knowledge, methods, processes and uses of science. Through building up a body of key foundational knowledge and concepts, students are encouraged to recognise the power of rational explanation and develop a sense of excitement and curiosity about natural phenomena. They are encouraged to understand how science can be used to explain what is occurring, predict how things will behave, and analyse causes. The themes are:

- Year 7: Being a Scientist, Pyrotechnics, Science and Sport, By the Seaside.
- Year 8: Space Traveller, Elementary my Dear, Feed the World, Out of this World, Staying Alive.
- Year 9: Modern Living, The Reactivity League.

Key Stage 4

GCSE Combined Science: Trilogy is taught in Years 9, 10 and 11. We follow the AQA specification. This is a double award course that covers different topics from Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Students also complete 21 required practicals that may be examined in the terminal examinations. Students are assessed as follows:

6 x terminal examinations – 2 Biology, 2 Chemistry and 2 Physics. The marks are collated and an award given ranging from 1/1 to 9/9.

Key Stage 5

At A Level, the following specifications are taught:

- Biology AQA
- Chemistry AQA
- Physics OCR

Person Specification

- Be able to teach full range of Sciences (Biology, Chemistry and Physics) at Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4.
- May also be expected to teach their specialism at A Level. An ability/willingness to teach your science specialism to A Level would be an advantage although not essential.
