3D Design at Caterham

3D Design replaced Design & Technology at Caterham as the School's 'design and make' subject. The decision to convert to this course was made in light of the changing classification of D&T and the increased creativity and freedom that is allowed within the Art & Design specification. The 3D Design course allows for more creativity and a broader spectrum of outcomes, which include furniture design, interior design, product design, lighting and jewellery. GCSE and A-Level students study 3D Design as part of the endorsed AQA Art and Design syllabus.

A wide range of skills, knowledge and understanding in design, along with the processes needed to realise ideas in three dimensions, are covered from the 1st Year onwards. All projects have a strong design element, which is researched, developed and realised by each student independently. Presentation skills, both in 2D and 3D are introduced, including the use of computers for both design and manufacture.

The department is based around two multi-purpose workshops, where hand and machine tools are used in the production of outcomes. There is also a fully equipped IT suite with the CAD programs Techsoft 2D Design, Google Sketchup, Rhino and Photoshop. The department also houses a Laser Cutter, flat bed router, vinyl cutter and three 3D printers which are

all widely used throughout the year groups and there is also a staff-only heavy machine room.

The Design department actively supports students learning with yearly visits to galleries and museums as a starting point for GCSE projects. There is no 'house style' within the department: the philosophy being to teach and develop skills, knowledge and understanding within the younger pupils and then to draw upon personal strengths and creative ideas as the pupils mature. Critical and observational studies are embedded within the work throughout the Key Stages. Teaching operates within a structured syllabus and a disciplined, but nonauthoritarian, working environment. Caterham is a school, which demands a high level of commitment from its staff. Co-curricular activities, within and outside their own department, are part of every teacher's job. Within the 3D Design department this includes lunchtime clubs, Saturday workshops each term (usually mornings but sometimes whole days). The successful applicant will be flexible, open and energetic, willing to contribute fully to the life of the department. He or she should enjoy working as part of a team, really care about our pupils and their education and have a passion for 3D Design!

- A well qualified and enthusiastic teacher is needed from September 2018 to teach 3D Design up to A-level within our creative 3D Design department.
- Applicants would be welcome from either, an Art and Design OR Design and Technology background.
- Candidates should have a good qualification in one or more of the following areas: Furniture, Interiors, Product or Jewellery or may be qualified within Art and have additional experience enabling them to be proficient as a 3D Design teacher.
- A good knowledge of CAD/CAM programs and machines would be an advantage.
- Applications from both NQT's and experienced teachers are most welcome.

The person appointed will be expected to play a full and positive part in the life of the School. The ability and willingness to become involved in, and contribute to other co-curricular activities will be essential.


confident in their ability to lead and with a clear appreciation of and respect for the views and potential of others. In so doing we remain true to our founding Christian principles and values.

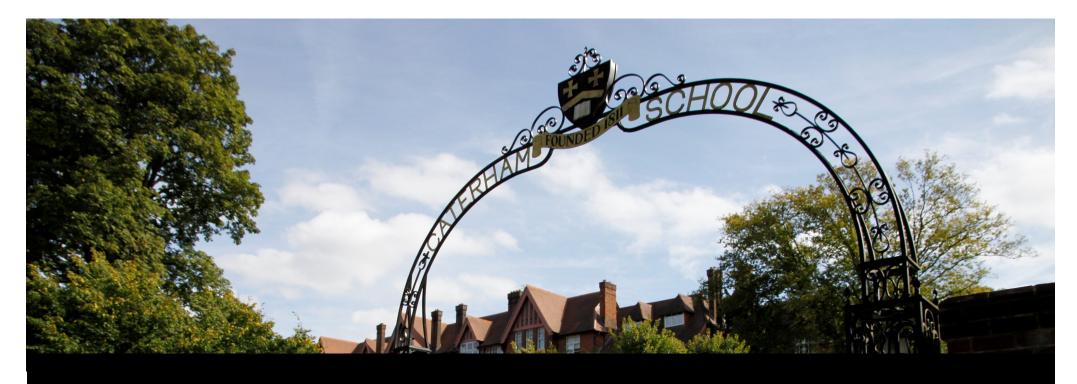
