Didcot Girls' School is a dynamic school. In December 2015, the school was judged to be Outstanding. As Ofsted recognised, we invest in all of our staff: 'Staff have exceptional opportunities for professional development. Staff feel valued and really like working in the school. Morale is very high. (Ofsted). Employing the right staff is key to our success. We believe that prioritising the wellbeing of our staff and investing in their professional development is the best way to release their potential. We are a values-driven school, committed to high quality teaching and learning and respectful relationships within an inclusive learning community. Didcot Girls' School is an 11-18 girls' comprehensive school with academy status with approximately 1350 students on roll. GCSE results this summer were superb once more, placing the school in the top 20% of schools nationally for both progress (Progress 8 of +0.34) and attainment. 74% of our 179 Year 11 students achieved a Grade 9 - 4 and above in English and Maths. Results at the highest levels are also outstanding across all subjects and 31 students achieved 6 or more grades at A*/A or grade 7-9. The school is genuinely comprehensive and our catchment area includes students from areas of relative deprivation as well as affluent socio-economic backgrounds. We are delighted to welcome increasing numbers of students from different cultures and we celebrate the diversity this brings to our school community. We run a large and successful mixed sixth form of approximately 350 students with St Birinus, the boys' school in Didcot. In September 2015, St Birinus School joined Didcot Girls' School in our multi-academy trust, the Ridgeway Education Trust. This partnership creates excellent opportunities and development for staff across both school sites.

Didcot Girls' School was accredited as a Teaching School Alliance in September 2017 and our Executive Headteacher, Rachael Warwick, is a National Leader in Education. The Teaching School creates additional opportunities for our staff to work within the Alliance supporting other schools as Specialist Leaders in Education.

The Department

The Psychology Department is staffed by two dynamic, talented and extremely supportive teachers.

Outcomes

Results at all levels are very strong. Last year, Year 11 students significantly outperformed national averages at both A*-A and A*-C. Disadvantaged students perform just as well as non-disadvantaged students in Psychology and we are very proud of this achievement. A Level Psychology is very popular with strong results of ALPS 2 last summer and 50% of students achieving A*-B grades. Many students continue to study Psychology at university.

Accommodation

There are two dedicated Psychology classrooms with projectors, whiteboards and laptops available. In addition, there is an upstairs office and kitchen facilities that are shared with Business Studies.

Curriculum

GCSE Psychology begins in Year 9 with students following the new Edexcel GCSE Specification. Psychology is very popular at Key Stage 4, with three classes in most year groups.
