Improving the quality of teaching for learning, pupil progress and achievement are therefore essential priorities, as is the ability of leadership at all levels to impact directly upon this agenda. Consequently challenge and expectation is high, but so are support, training and encouragement. Teaching well every lesson, every day, is the key priority and expectation for all teaching staff.

The English Department

The English department is a hardworking and effective team comprising a cohesive mix of experience and youthful talent and enthusiasm.

Teaching quality is good and pupil progress is good although both have capacity to improve still further.

Given the importance of English, the team includes a Head of Department and a number of staff with responsibilities for KS3 and KS4. The team currently has 10 teaching staff with a range of experience.

English is taught in ability sets in all years and curriculum time at KS3 (Y7 & 8) and KS4 (Y9, 10 & 11) with English Literature being formally sat at the end Y10. All classrooms

are located on the English corridor and classrooms are equipped with Interactive White Boards.

KS4 pupils follow the AQA, English Language and Literature qualification.
