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The Curriculum and Beyond

We aim to make learning exciting, challenging and interesting, through the provision of a rich and varied curriculum as we recognise that children learn best when they are well motivated and enthused about what they are doing. Whilst an appropriate emphasis is placed on Literacy and Numeracy, we ensure our pupils receive a broad and balanced curriculum covering all subjects. Our innovative optional subjects, taught in years 7 and 8 provide opportunities rarely found in other settings. Outcomes for pupils in year 8 are consistently high, with Arnold Academy regularly amongst the highest performing middle schools in the country. Our pupils go on to achieve highly at GCSE, A level and beyond.

Enrichment and Extra-curricular Opportunities

Learning beyond the curriculum is just as important to us, which is why we offer such a rich and varied programme of extra-curricular activities. Our pupils have the opportunity to take part in a huge variety of clubs, teams and activities for all interests, talents and abilities. We are an extremely successful sporting school, with many of our teams winning county championships and competing at national level. A Stunning Location and Excellent Facilities

Lying on the outskirts of Barton le Clay, with views of the Chiltern Hills and surrounding countryside, Arnold Academy enjoys an enviable location. We also benefit from having first rate, modern facilities and well maintained school buildings and grounds.

A middle school education has many advantages, not least of which are the specialist teaching areas and teachers who are experts in their field. Here at Arnold we benefit from modern, specialist facilities and well maintained buildings and grounds; these fantastic resources allow us to really focus on providing the best teaching and learning possible for our pupils.

We are also very proud of our specialist provision for supporting children with Special Educational Needs. The Chiltern Class is a self-contained unit that specifically supports the learning of pupils with Autism. The Pastoral and Learning Mentor (PALM) Centre is another unit, staffed by specialists, that supports our pupils who may be experiencing difficulties that are affecting their relationships or learning.

The very core of our belief is that every child has the right to be safe, happy and successful. Arnold Academy places great emphasis on developing the whole person, with a strong focus on social and emotional development as well as academic learning.

To achieve our vision of happy, successful children, every element of our pastoral support structure has been created to ensure that each child has the opportunity to establish a strong relationship with an adult to whom they can go to seek support and guidance. The form tutor is the child's first point of contact and plays a lead role in providing this support, ensuring that both their academic and pastoral development are the best they can be.

For successful emotional health and well-being we recognise the importance of creating a culture of mutual respect, and aim to achieve this through our Values based approach, as such we have established 'The Arnold Charter'.

Working in partnership with families and through our embedded systems we are very successful in influencing our pupils' experiences so every child is a happy and confident learner.

Our well established Pastoral and Learning Mentoring centre (PALM), staffed by specialists, provides an array of additional support opportunities that complements the role of the form tutor and encourages children to engage in open and meaningful discussion. This safe and nurturing environment enables young people to develop life-long social and emotional skills, thereby setting them on the road to personal growth and happiness.
