"ICT is used effectively to support learning. Each pupil has access to a tablet, which is used in a range of ways to support lessons and other activities. For example, pupils can complete and submit work for teachers to mark online, use their tablets as whiteboards for quick-response questions and use them instead of textbooks. Pupils find it motivating and enjoyable using tablets, and say that the instant feedback it can provide is really helpful." (Ofsted 2017)

Blenheim is a fantastic place in which to work. We have a strong and experienced Leadership Team, a large and vibrant student body and dynamic staff who are willing to work hard to ensure positive learning experiences for young people. # BACKGROUND INFORMATION



Blenheim is a dynamic, exciting and supportive environment in which to work. The school opened in September 1997 with one year group and has grown to its current size of approximately 1370 students on roll including over 200 in the Sixth Form. Blenheim is a mixed comprehensive and our reputation in the community is excellent and as a result the school is very popular. The intake comprises of students from all areas surrounding the school and ability levels and the cultural blend is varied. Candidates should be entirely committed to the comprehensive ideal of education.

We converted to Academy status in March 2012 and through our Science specialism which now includes Maths and Technology, we have developed many community and primary school links.

We are fortunate to have outstanding facilities and we are a well-resourced school. All classrooms are equipped with interactive whiteboards and we work hard to provide a stimulating environment in which to learn. We have launched an iPad for Learning Scheme under which all students have access to an iPad, the majority having their own personal device. All teaching staff, therefore need to be willing and committed to using new technologies as a tool for enhancing learning. We work closely with Apple and we hope to become an Apple Distinguished school in the near future.

Visitors to the school constantly remark on the calm, purposeful learning ethos that they observe. We are fortunate for the school to be situated in its own grounds and have grass football and rugby pitches along with gardens around the school. We also have an All Weather Pitch and excellent sports facilities.

We have extremely high expectations of the students and believe in a traditional approach to school uniform and behaviour. Staff are expected to have high aspiration in all that they do and to work hard in order to achieve the very best for all our students. That said, we support staff fully both in their day to day work and their professional development. We hold a comprehensive professional development programme on a weekly basis and expect all staff to take responsibility for their continuing development. We hold an annual two day conference for all staff and offer professional development bursaries for specific areas of development within the school. We also support staff who may wish to continue their academic study. The Staff Association offers a range of social and sporting opportunities which are always very popular and staff are entitled to a full benefits package including for example the cycle to work scheme, employee assistance etc.

Blenheim is situated five minutes' walk from Ewell West train station which is an Oyster card station and within easy reach of the M25. We are, therefore, easily accessible from central London or Surrey and the Home Counties.

# Science Curriculum Area Information



The Curriculum Area, which is housed in well-equipped and well-maintained Science laboratories, is staffed by sixteen teachers with specialists from all three branches of Science. The teaching is supported by an experienced team of five highly effective technicians.

These are exciting times in the development of Science at Blenheim. In September 2004 Blenheim was designated as a Specialist Science College and many new initiatives have been implemented to build on the outstanding Science teaching that was already taking place. Three new Science laboratories have been constructed, bringing the total to thirteen, and all are equipped with interactive whiteboards. In the last three years, we have introduced a range of resources to support student learning with iPads. These include a range of interactive class activities, quizzes, data recording techniques and assessment tools.


At present, Key Stage 3 students study a modular course of Science units adapted from the popular 'Activate' scheme. It is a well-resourced teaching programme, incorporating a wide range of practical and assessment activities. The majority of students follow a programme aimed at completing Key Stage 3 in just over two years, allowing more time to develop the skills required for success at GCSE. At Key Stage 4, most students study either Double Award GCSE Science (AQA Science followed by Additional Science) or Triple Science GCSE in Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Staff generally teach

their Science specialist subjects at Key Stage 4, but may on some occasions be required to teach other Science disciplines.

In the 6th Form, the Curriculum Area offers all three main Science subjects at AS and A2 level. The Biology Department is following the new AQA A-Level course, which is proving very popular with students and teachers alike and both Chemistry and Physics follow the OCR A courses.

The curriculum team work very closely together sharing common aims and good practice. They have developed into a very successful part of the school through high quality, innovative teaching and the development of a calm, disciplined learning environment.

Hopefully, these few words have been of some help and have convinced you that the Science Curriculum Area at Blenheim is the place to further your future career.
