Dear Applicant,

Thank you for expressing an interest in applying to work within the St Ralph Sherwin Catholic Multi-Academy Trust (CMAT). As CEO, I want to provide you with an introduction to our Trust and to give you a flavour of what working within our Trust would be like.

Firstly, you do not need to be a Catholic to work in our Trust. There are certain reserved positions, which require someone to be Catholic, i.e. CEO, Headteacher, Deputy Headteacher, Subject Leader/Head of RE and Lay Chaplain but other than that a respect for our ethos and a willingness to participate in what we do is all that is required.

Everybody who works within our Trust, in a school or central offices is in some way a teacher. Class Teacher Job Description

Responsible to: The Headteacher

English Martyrs' Catholic Voluntary Academy has been designated by the Secretary of State as an academy with a religious character. The Articles of Association state that it is part of the Catholic Church and is to be conducted as a Catholic academy in accordance with Canon Law, the teaching of the Roman Catholic Church and the Trust Deed of the Diocese of Nottingham. This appointment is with the directors of Saint Ralph Sherwin Catholic Multi Academy Trust under the terms of the Catholic Education Service contract signed with the directors as employers. The appointment is subject to the current conditions of service for teachers contained in the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document and other current education and employment legislation. In carrying out his/her duties, the Class Teacher shall consult with the Headteacher and when appropriate, with the local governing body, the Diocese, the Local Authority, the staff, the parents of its pupils, the parishes served by the academy and the academies within the Saint Ralph Sherwin Catholic Multi Academy Trust.

The Diocese of Nottingham, the Academy Trust and the Local Governing Body are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young persons and will ensure that the highest priority is given to following the guidance and regulations to safeguard children and young people. The successful candidate will be required to undergo an Enhanced Check from the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) and any other pre-employment checks required by the Academy Trust.

Catholic Purpose and Identity of the School

The Class Teacher must understand the nature and purpose of Catholic education and know that their first responsibility is to support the Headteacher and senior leaders in establishing and sustaining the Catholic identity of the academy and safeguarding the teachings of the Church.

Develop a stimulating classroom and school environment in which a child will learn, have a sense of achievement, be motivated and feel secure and valued

Ensure high quality learning experiences for pupils which meets internal and external quality standards

Ensure that all pupils make good progress by regularly monitoring classroom practice and analysing sets of assessment information

Take a lead in planning for intervention support when pupils are identified as in danger of falling behind

Share in the development of the school curriculum, schemes of work, teaching materials, teaching programmes, methods of teaching and assessment and their review

Support and contribute to the school's responsibility for safeguarding children

Actively promote the policy and practice of inclusion

Carry out other responsibilities to be negotiated with the Head Teacher

The class teacher will:

Direct and supervise the work of Teaching Assistants.

Co-operate and liaise with other professionals, including fellow staff, SENCO and colleagues from external agencies e.g. specialist teachers from the LEA support services, health professionals, social workers etc.

Lead a curriculum subject area

Curriculum Responsibilities

The class teacher will:

Be responsible for the leadership of a curriculum area

Support and advise colleagues, using any expertise to assess and develop the quality of learning.

Monitor and evaluate learning within the curriculum area in line with the school's monitoring cycle

Collate and analyse information relating to the standards achieved in the curriculum area

Personal Development, Behaviour and Welfare

The class teacher will:

Strive to live out the academy Mission Statement

Provide an excellent model of positive professional behaviour and self-discipline following the Academy Trust Code of Conduct

Promote the highest standards of behaviour for pupils

Ensure that all safeguarding policies and procedures are followed rigorously

Communication

The class teacher will:

Fully support the ethos and educational mission of the academy

Help maintain and further develop positive relationships with parents, Governors, local parishes and the wider community Provide information and support to the Local Governing Body to enable it to meet its statutory responsibilities
