This is the student motto. Our broad, balanced and personalised curriculum offers a range of subjects and is responsive to the needs of all students of all ages, whilst developing their skills to become successful learners, confident individuals and responsible citizens.

As proud and active members of the Minsthorpe Primary Partnership, we start early with our younger learners in the primary feeder schools to ensure that every child has a smooth transition to Minsthorpe Community College. This is successfully delivered through an extensive package of primary liaison and joint project work and was a feature praised highly during our last two Ofsted inspections.

The two year Key Stage 3 curriculum is underpinned by the focus on Skills for Learning, supported by the cross-curricular subject Learning 4 Life. Both academic and vocational courses are on offer at Key Stage 4, with the opportunity for students to continue studying the same courses in Post 16, plus further additional academic and vocational subjects. The college operates an open entry sixthform policy providing appropriate opportunities for all students to continue their studies at all levels.

We have a very cohesive programme of SMSC development, which is complemented by a diverse programme of extra-curricular opportunities, and a positive climate for learning exists at the college.
