## The School

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St. Andrew's School was founded in 1937 and is an established, respected and thriving co-educational Prep school of around 310 children from the ages of 3 to 13. Our form groups are small with a maximum of 20 in each class.

The School is set in 11 acres of grounds within a quiet residential area approximately half a mile from Woking town centre. St. Andrew's has an abundance of on-site facilities including an all-weather sports surface, sports pitches, tennis courts, cricket nets and a swimming pool. Over the years we have developed a wide range of purpose built facilities including a science laboratory, ICT room, art, design and technology room and a multi-purpose sports hall. Plans are in place for further development of our impressive site in the future.
