	Location:	Quarry Theatre, Bedford School		
	Reporting Line:	Director of Theatre		
	Hours:	37 hours per week (although there may be a need for flexibility as more hours may be required during term time and less during school holidays) but the post-holder will be required to work as necessary to complete the job (subject to the Working Time Regulations 1998)		
	Contract:	This is a fixed term contract for 12 months, from 1 September 2018 – 31 August 2019. This will be reviewed in the summer term of 2019, with the possibility that the role may become permanent.		
	Salary:	Circa £22,000 to £24,000 per annum		
	The role would suit someone who has worked in a busy theatre before and who has technical theatre knowledge and experience. There may also be opportunities to get involved with marketing, front of house, production and stage management.			
Main duties and responsibilities	This job description does not form part of the contract of employment and may be varied in accordance with the demands of the appointment.  The main duties and responsibilities of the Theatre Technician are as follows (this list is not exhaustive):			
	• Responsible for all technical aspects of the theatre (in conjunction with the Director of Theatre and Assistant Theatre Manager); including external professional shows and			

events, and internal school productions and events

'Technical aspects of the theatre' may include: lighting design & operation, sound design & operation, live music engineering & operation, set design & construction, filming and operating projection equipment and live-streaming equipment, helping companies to 'get-in'

- Working with Drama Technical club for students in the prep school and senior school
- Leading specialist workshops on lighting and sound design
- Providing assistance and expertise for GCSE Drama Design students
- Helping to operate the box office and ticketing system if required
- Working as part of the front of house team when appropriate
- Helping to market and promote the theatre and associated events
- Stage-managing school shows (if relevant)
- Mentoring students and helping to train them, and volunteers, in any of the above activities
- Participating in trips that directly relate to drama/theatre
- Maintaining confidentiality at all times in respect of school-related matters and to prevent disclosure of confidential and sensitive information
- Supporting and contributing to the School's responsibility for safeguarding students and young people from the wider community
- Working within the School's health and safety policy to ensure a safe working environment for staff, pupils and visitors
- Maintaining professional standards of attendance, punctuality, appearance and conduct with pupils, parents, colleagues and visitors
- To undertake any other reasonable duties as requested by the Director of Theatre
