



GENERAL BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Walton High opened in 1999 with 120 Year 8 students. Since then the school has grown; has opened a second campus at Brooklands and now has over 1750 students on roll, including over 350 Post 16. The school has an excellent reputation and is consistently oversubscribed.

In 2011 the Governors of Walton High founded Milton Keynes Education Trust with the following aims:

The ADT team consists of three product design teachers, two food teachers, one textiles teacher, five art teachers and three technicians across ADT. We have large numbers studying Art, Design and Technology across GCSE and A level. The Product Design facilities consist of two workshops, a heat treatment room, a computer suite and a preparation area.

The Walnut Tree campus has two food preparation rooms which are both equipped with interactive boards. We have brand new facilities at our Brooklands campus. One traditional food preparation room fully equipped in readiness for new curriculum and a state of the art professional training kitchen where we are planning to teach post 16 students in 2018.

The enthusiasm of the students extends beyond the lessons and we are looking for an enthusiastic teacher who will contribute to the extra and cross curricular activities of the team. These include clubs, healthy food week, an Arts evening, master classes and trips.
