Function of the post

The Director of English is responsible for:

- Leading and managing all aspect of English education within the school.
- Leading the work of the English department to ensure the highest standards from all staff and the highest achievement by all students
- Being a key member of the senior leadership team

Main Tasks and Responsibilities

- 1. To teach English in years 7 13.
- 2. To evaluate performance data and implement strategies to raise attainment, including for different groups especially disadvantaged students
- 3. To be responsible for the department's development work to ensure further raising of achievement
- 4. To be responsible for the effective line management of the post holders within the department so that roles are fulfilled and the whole team work effectively together
- 5. To be responsible for the setting of high expectations and monitoring and evaluation of all English work done in the department by teachers and students.
- 6. To be a member of the extended leadership team; taking on responsibility for an initiative or project and contributing fully to school development and improvement, including modelling excellent practice as a subject leader
- 7. To fulfil the requirements of a subject teacher as outlined in the Staff Handbook.
- 8. To fulfil the role of a Leader of the Faculty as outlined in the Staff Handbook and as a member of the school development group, to contribute to whole school development and policies and to implement these
- 9. To carry out all responsibilities in accordance with the school's equal opportunities policies.
