School Information

King's Ely is comprised of: King's Ely Acremont (Nursery, reception, Years 1 and 2), King's Ely Junior (Years 3-8), King's Ely Senior (Years 9-13) and King's Ely International.

The post is full-time and includes teaching across the age and ability range from year 7 to 13. There is also an opportunity for Further Maths teaching in the Sixth Form. Lessons are from 50 minutes to 55 long. The timetable includes lessons on Monday through to Friday. There are a number of Saturday commitments throughout the school year.

Departmental Information

In the King's Ely Senior Mathematics Department there are six full-time Mathematics teachers and three part-time teachers. The Head of Department is Ms Audrienne Bezzina. There is a suite of six specialist Mathematics classrooms, each equipped with a computer and an interactive whiteboard. The department has access to ICT classrooms to aid in delivering the new curriculum. Software used by the department includes Maths Integral, Autograph and MyMaths programs.

The Senior School begins in Year 9. There are 5 or 6 Mathematics sets in each of years 9 to 11. Numbers in each set range from 24 in the top sets to fewer than 12 in the lowest. In Year 11 the pupils take OCR Mathematics GCSE (J560). At A and AS Levels Edexcel Mathematics and Further Mathematics are offered, and the subject is popular in the Sixth Form. At present, in Y12 we have about 40 pupils studying Mathematics and one set of 15 studying Further Mathematics.
