

All of our students have access to tablet computers. We work hard to ensure that all of our students develop the skills to become effective independent learners, thereby equipping them for the next step in their education.

Classrooms are all equipped with large screen LED TVs and staff have both laptop computers and tablets.

Staff are encouraged and fully supported to utilise new technologies fully to share resources with students, parents and other teaching staff. We also use a range of social networks including Facebook and Edmodo.

Our students all learn the skill of 3D design and printing and we have a 100% pass rate at GCSE in Smart Product Design and Manufacture which combines computing, electronica and design and utlises our impressive set of 3D printers.

Excellence in the classroom

e believe that all of our students deserve the very best in their classroom experience. This means recruiting the best teachers, buying the best resources and insisting on the highest standards from staff and students alike.

We have a very traditional curriculum, focusing on the core subjects whilst also recognising that a wide and diverse curriculum is vital if all students are to succeed. We have a longer teaching day than many schools with six lessons each of fifty five minutes plus a compulsory enrichment hour daily.

In KS3 Mathematics and English is taught every day, highlighting the importance we attach to these subjects. Our longer teaching day ensures that other subjects do not miss out.

The time spent with the form tutor each day is vital and we believe that vertical tutoring allows all of our students to take positive example and support from older students.

Our House system also ensures that healthy competition plays an important part in all aspects of our school life.

Frequently Asked Questions

What level would I be teaching?

Core subjects are taught to GCSE and A' Level, so staff will eventually have the opportunity to teach groups from Year 7 to Year 13. A number of subjects such as Psychology, Media, Theatre Studies and Health & Social Care are only offered at post-16.

How would Sir Thomas Fremantle School help me progress in my career?

We are fully committed to providing high quality ongoing CDP for all of our staff. We will work closely with local training schools ensuring that our staff are kept up to date with all developments in teaching and learning. We also believe that the our school will provide staff with unparalleled opportunities to develop their own skills and experience.

Does STFS pay structure follow the nationally agreed pay scales?

The school broadly follows the national pay scales. The Trust Governors are committed to offering rewards for excellence and responsibility and therefore they will retain flexibility to award financial bonuses where appropriate.

It looks like a long school day, what hours will I be expected to be in school?

All staff are required to be in school by 8:20am and are also expected to attend until the enrichment concludes at 4:30pm. Most staff meetings take place during these times. Some staff may have additional hours negotiated as part of their contract. Holidays are generally in line with Buckinghamshire schools. A willingness to accept an amount of flexibility of working hours is however, a pre-requisite of any teaching post at the school.
