Newcastle is a beautiful city. From the bridges sweeping over the Tyne to the stunning Theatre Royal, the city has plenty of world class architecture. Grey Street, in the heart of the city centre, is often named the most beautiful street in Britain while the Tyne Bridge is an iconic symbol of Newcastle. What's more, living here gives you the best of both worlds, with the sandy blue flag beaches of Tynemouth, Cullercoats and Whitley Bay an easy 20 minute drive from Newcastle city centre and Northumberland National Park less than an hour away in the opposite direction.



# **GETTING AROUND**

The Metro over ground service covers Newcastle, Gateshead, South Shields and Sunderland, as well as the airport and the coast and several bus companies operate services in the area. The A1 motorway connects the region. Market towns Morpeth and Alnwick are less than one hour drive, the latter being home to Alnwick Gardens and Castle, made famous as one of the locations used in the Harry Potter films. To the south of Newcastle, historical Durham city and its Romanesque cathedral is only a 30 minute drive.

### HOUSING
