SECTION C: PURPOSE OF POST

To teach Maritime Studies

SECTION D: Main duties and Responsibilities/Functional Links

- 1. To teach maritime studies. Roughly half of the post holder's time will be spent on water sports sessions, so the post holder will need to be qualified to instructor level in either kayaking or sailing. The remaining half of the timetable will focus on level 2 and 3 maritime studies teaching. The maritime studies teacher will need to be able to teach navigation, passage planning, commercial vessel types and purposes, and about the wider maritime sector.
- 2. It is advantageous, but not essential, for the post holder to have powered vessel qualifications (either RYA powerboat qualifications or coastal skipper)
- 3. To plan lessons and mark homework in accordance with the normal school policies.
- 4. To maintain records of pupil progress. This includes national governing body awards for on water activities.
- 5. Adhere to school policies and procedures
- 6. To write reports and attend parents evenings for the pupils taught by the maritime studies teacher.
- 7. To attend whole school and departmental meetings, where appropriate.
- 8. Work within health and safety guidelines and be aware of your responsibilities for health and safety.
- 9. Be responsible for safeguarding and protecting the welfare of children, young people and vulnerable adults.

- 10. Share in the responsibilities for the well-being and discipline of all students according to school guidelines.
- 11. To liaise with relevant external agencies and other young people's services to ensure that support needs are identified and met early.
- 12. To work with the head of department, to ensure that standard operating procedures are in line with the National Governing Body and AALA guidelines.
- 13. To assist in keeping the nautical department organised with respect to learning resources, worksheets, and schemes of work.
- 14. To record and report any maintenance needs of the school boats such as items wearing out or breakage.
- 15. To work with the nautical department team, in the repairs to, and movement of boats.
- 16. To be actively involved in all aspects of the schools outdoor and nautical programmes, including occasional nautical residential trips such as voyages on the Thames Barges.
- 17. To participate in any professional development activities as required.
- 18. To undertake such duties as maybe reasonably requested by the line manager of a member of the SLT.
- 19. To undertake training appropriate with the position, including outdoor and adventurous activity instructor/ leader courses as appropriate to the position.
- 20. Attend planning and staff meetings as required.
