Leadership

If in the course of carrying out the duties of the role, the job holder identifies any instance that a child is suffering or likely to suffer significant harm either at school or at home, s/he must report any concerns to the School's Designated Safeguarding Lead or to the Head or indeed to the Cognita Regional Safeguarding Manager so that a referral can be made accordingly to the relevant third party services.

Specific Responsibilities

The key duties include but are not limited to:

- Respecting and valuing a child's expertise, community, family and social contexts, cultural traditions and understandings and home language/s
- Providing a program that responds to each child's wellbeing, positive sense of identity and confidence as a learner and participant
- Ensuring the health and safety of the children in their care, including appropriately supervising children at all times

In respect to children, the AIS Infant Care Coordinator is required to implement and guide other educators in the following, but not limited to:

- Creating environments that respond to children's individual personalities, wellbeing, dispositions for learning, strengths, abilities, interests and multiple ways of learning
- Resourcing and challenging children as they explore and develop their ideas
- Keeping accurate records of individual children to support future planning
- Facilitating play, leisure and learning as initiated by the children and ensuring this is implemented by educators in the unit

In respect to families, the AIS Infant Care Coordinator is required to implement and guide other educators in the following, but not limited to:

- Demonstrating effective partnerships with families through open and regular communication
- Sharing with families their child's involvement in activities and development

- Implementing a balanced and child-centred daily routine
