

## Teacher of Computer Science Job Description



### School Information

King's Ely is comprised of: King's Ely Nursery (Little Ones, Plus Twos, Nursery 1 and 2), King's Ely Acremont (Nursery, reception, Years 1 and 2), King's Ely Junior (Years 3-8), King's Ely Senior (Years 9-13) and King's Ely International.

The post is part-time teaching GCSE and A Level Computer Science. Lessons are from 50 minutes to 55 minutes long. The timetable includes lessons on Monday through to Friday, but most part time timetables work over three days. This role is approximately 14 hours a week of teaching.

### Departmental Information

In the King's Ely Senior Computing Department there are two full-time Computing teachers and one part-time teacher.

The Senior School begins in Year 9. There are 5 Computing sets in Year 9 and pupils can take AQA Computer Science as a GCSE option in Year 10. There are currently one Year 10 and one Year 11 Computer Science classes. At A Level, AQA A level Computer Science is offered, with currently 9 students studying at Year 12 and 3 students at Year 13. The department has a dedicated Computing suite and an additional teaching classroom for teaching Computer Science. There are other computing suites in other parts of the school.

- Keep up to date with developments in Computing and recent curriculum initiatives.
