High Standards of Teaching and Learning:	To prepare lessons for classes up to GCSE/A level based on a sound understanding of the learning needs of every student. To teach assigned classes using a range of appropriate resources and strategies including ICT to engage students. To have knowledge of the learners' individual needs including very high attainers and those who have SEND and plan accordingly. To liaise with the Learning Support team as required. To assess and monitor student learning including giving verbal and written feedback which facilitates student progress. To follow schemes of work agreed within the Faculty and make a contribution to their development. To establish and maintain a positive classroom climate which supports the achievement of every student. To promote high standards of behaviour and engagement by using the school's policy and agreed approaches.		
Knowledge/ Skills:	To maintain up to date knowledge of English teaching and of research and inspection findings. To maintain knowledge of the relevant curriculum and course requirements at GCSE/A Level. To be able to communicate effectively, explaining and modelling ideas as required by all courses.
