
The College

The Spires College is a co-educational, 11-18 college with a bilateral stream. It is situated in the Plainmoor district of Torquay, within the Local Authority of Torbay. There are currently around 900 students on roll. We are a friendly, caring college which puts the needs of our children at the heart of all we do. Academic progress is obviously vital but we also place a high value on the provision of enrichment opportunities that help our students to grow into responsible, confident and considerate young adults. Underpinning all of this are excellent standards of pastoral support and care that allow children to feel safe and valued.

Torbay is an area with a Selective Grammar School system: parents can choose for their child to take the '11+' test if they wish for them to apply for a place at one of the selective schools in the area. The Spires College is one of very few schools in the country with bilateral streams. This allows us to take up to 60 students each year into a selective stream (out of a 220 PAN). Students who have reached a designated score in the '11+' test can apply to our selective stream to access a challenging academic curriculum.

We have a modern, purpose-built building offering fantastic facilities for both students and staff alike. All full time teachers have their own classroom. We are committed to the professional learning of our teachers to ensure classroom practice is as good as it can possibly be. Every teacher follows a personalised CPD programme based on individual needs and interests and every teacher is involved in research and professional reading.

The Department



Design and Technology sits within the Department of Creative Arts and Technologies. There are currently three design and technology teachers and two specialist technicians within that team.

At The Spires College we believe that Creative Arts and Technologies subjects play an exciting and leading role in enhancing the life, imagination and education of our students and the surrounding community. Through a continual focus on the highest quality teaching and learning in music, art and photography, design and technology and drama, we seek to build an aspirational, creative environment where students develop a love of learning and creativity through engaging and wide-ranging schemes of learning and extra-curricular activities.

Our vision is to foster an environment where independent and collaborative opportunities encourage each student in confident risk-taking so that they can express their individuality and pursue their ambition, however great. We believe that involvement in the Creative Arts and Technologies helps to foster a positive attitude in our community by developing a wide range of qualities such as cooperation, enthusiasm, passion, inspiration, tenacity and ambition. In our outstanding facilities, we help students to acquire an important sense of belonging as well as build the self-confidence they need to do well and make their first steps towards higher education and employment.

Creative Arts and Technologies teachers contribute to an extensive programme of extracurricular activities both in and out of normal school hours.

Design and Technology

Design and Technology teachers and students at The Spires College enjoy superbly equipped teaching spaces. Facilities include fully equipped catering rooms, resistant material workshops, a purpose-built construction room and a computer suite. Students currently develop CAD/CAM skills using our laser cutter, vinyl plotter and CNC router. In addition, there is a large programmable oven in the catering room.



Curriculum

Key Stage 3 students have one hour of design and technology each week, rotating between food, resistant materials and systems and control units of work. Students learn to build on previous knowledge and skills through a cycle of research, generating ideas, development, making and evaluating. There are three rotation projects in Year 7 and six shorter rotation projects in Year 8.

Key Stage 4 students have the opportunity to study GCSE Food Preparation and Nutrition, GCSE Product Design and BTEC Engineering.

In Key Stage 5, we currently offer AQA Level 3 Foundation Technical Level in Engineering.

Enrichment

The Design and Technology department offers a range of extra-curricular opportunities for all students including electronics, textiles and resistant materials clubs. High profile competitions have included The Spires College Bake-Off and The Spires College Masterchef competitions. Design and Technology students have been involved in a range of external projects including the MADE Project and Bloodhound Project. Last year we were very proud of our Year 8 students who won the inter-school challenge finals at the TechBay: Engineering Your Future event.

- Ensure school is immediately notified of any issues that may affect your right to maintain enhanced clearance to work on the school site (DBS).


