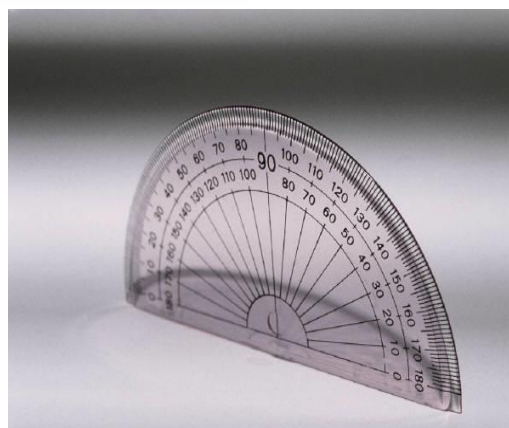

Woodford County High School is an 11-18 selective girls' community school. It is set in attractive grounds and offers a very pleasant and friendly working environment. Hitherto a four form of entry school (4fe), we took our first 6fe cohort into Year 7 in September 2016. Building work associated with the school's expansion will shortly be completed – one of many exciting developments as the school approaches its centenary (2019). Maths and Science relocated to the new building in September 2018.

Mathematics is a thriving department and achieves excellent results, encouraging girls to pursue the subject at a higher level, including at Oxford and Cambridge. All members of the department are able to teach to further Maths level. We are seeking for September 2017 a well-qualified and enthusiastic mathematician. The successful candidate must be organised and motivated, working to the highest standards and aiming to fulfil the aims of the school and the department. They will also be able to build good working relationships with staff and pupils alike, be encouraging, professional and attentive to pupil's pastoral and academic development. The school is working to promote STEM opportunities to girls and the teacher appointed will be expected actively to support this aim.

The students are taught in tutor groups of thirty students throughout Key Stage 3 and then in mixed sets for Year 10 and 11. Students in KS4 follow the Edexcel Linear GCSE Mathematics Higher course. In the Sixth Form the department offers Mathematics and Further Mathematics courses to A-Level. Mathematics is a very popular choice among a large and enthusiastic Sixth Form.

Mathematics is well resourced and in the new accommodation all classrooms are equipped with the latest smart screens (Clevartouch). Training will be provided to ensure colleagues are confident in their use.

Most full-time members of staff are form teachers, and the successful applicant should be prepared to undertake the responsibilities that this entails. Form teachers have a vital role to play in the general development and support of the members of their form: our pastoral structure rests on them and much home/school contact is established through them.
