## About East London Arts & Music (ELAM)

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ELAM is a world-class 16-19 Academy which opened in September 2014. ELAM offers young people everything that they will need to lead successful lives within the music, games design and film and television sectors.

Our vision is to better the creative industries of tomorrow. We believe this can be achieved by increasing the access routes into those industries for talented young people. The creative industries in the UK continue to do well and are currently worth £92 Billion to the economy, while growing at more than double the speed of the wider economy. However, unlike many other industries, it is not always clear how to get into these jobs and therefore there is often lack of diversity within these sectors. Increasing the access routes to everyone will therefore increase the quality of talent and the continued growth of the sector long term.

ELAM seeks to achieve this by providing industry standard courses for our trainees in Music, Games Design and Film and Television. We have partnered with sector leading organisations including YouTube, Universal Music and Creative Assembly to devise a curriculum that will develop the future leaders of these sectors by meeting the relevant knowledge, skills and cultural demands. In addition, all trainees at ELAM undertake a study of Maths and English as we identified the skills provided by these subjects, such as written and oral communication, problem solving, data analysis and research are the key traits of the current leaders of these fields.

We had our first full Ofsted inspection in May 2017 and received a grading of Outstanding in every category and while this is a huge achievement and something that we are immensely proud of, we are also still a long way from meeting our vision. There is still a lot of work to do and as a school we are restless in the pursuit of achieving this.

## About English at ELAM

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At ELAM, our English curriculum is very unlike mainstream provision in that we have freedom to develop our own bespoke Level 3 Creative Writing course (which culminates in the production of a portfolio for the Extended Project Qualification or EPQ). As a result, we have been able to focus on contemporary writers from diverse backgrounds, real-life industry briefs for nonfiction journalism, and offer spoken word performance opportunities for our budding poets. We also run an academic A level course and a GCSE resit course, both of which have very high standards of achievement and engagement.

## Role Purpose & Description

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You will be responsible for the planning, delivery and marking of lessons for each strand (A level, GCSE and Level 3 courses) with the aim of achieving exceptional outcomes in all qualifications and providing a very high quality experience for the trainees on all strands of the English programme. They will also be expected to promote the English department more widely, for example through running meaningful extra-curricular activities or building relationships with external organisations to provide speakers and facilitators for English Masterclass .

## Role Responsibilities

- ☐ Excitement about the opportunities that a bespoke course and free choice of task and text offer the English curriculum
- ☐ Very high standards of planning and a reflective approach to improving teaching lessons and schemes of work
- ☐ A passionate commitment to the subject including a commitment to every trainee becoming a reader
- ☐ Unwavering belief that all trainees can attain the highest possible grades in English regardless of prior engagement or achievement in the subject
- ☐ An understanding of how English can supplement the personal development and employability of our trainees
- ☐ An understanding of the importance of high quality feedback
- ☐ A willingness to engage trainees in an innovative compulsory English curriculum including a commitment to diversity of stimulus texts and writers

- ❑ An industry-focused approach to the English curriculum including engagement with external stakeholders such as poets, publishers and Higher Education Creative Writing departments
- ❑ Play an active pastoral role as an Academy Tutor and ensure that our Trainee's emotional and social needs are met and that they feel part of our overall community;
- ❑ Engage with the ELAM Extended Day by providing opportunities for ELAM's Trainees outside of the teaching day;
- ❑ Actively promote the achievements of Trainees; and
- ❑ Safeguard and promote the wellbeing of all Trainees and provide learning experiences that are personalised to their needs.

## Person Specification

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**ELAM is a values based organisation and therefore we are looking for people who can both reflect and identify with our five core values. We have outlined below what we expect these to look like on a day to day basis in this role.**

### ***Excellence***

Our vision requires us to have high standards. We want our trainees to be the leaders of the creative industries one day and thus our staff and provision needs to reflect this, otherwise our work won't achieve our goals. We are looking for people who can demonstrate the following:

- ❑ undergraduate degree (desirable);
- ❑ qualified teacher status (desirable);
- ❑ track record of achieving outstanding student results;
- ❑ experience of writing schemes of work (desirable);
- ❑ excellent organisation and planning skills; and
- ❑ outstanding classroom practice with a proven record of ensuring the excellent progression of students across all abilities;

### ***Innovation***

As a relatively new institution, a large part of our early success has been as a result of the opportunity we were given to innovate and test new practices, processes and systems. This is a huge part of our culture and something we want to retain as we continue to grow. While this is incredibly exciting, it is also extremely challenging at times. We are therefore looking for people who can demonstrate the following:

- ❑ comfortable with IT and technology, we use IT and specifically the Google Suite (Google Classroom, Gmail, Docs etc) extensively across the school. We are not

looking for programmers but for people that will be comfortable in such an environment;

- ☐ experience of using data and other contextual information to inform practice;
- ☐ able to innovate and look at conventional practices and problems from new angles to achieve ambitious outcomes; and
- ☐ skilled at implementing and developing student culture of high expectations and achievement.

### ***Integrity***

At ELAM we have a strong vision for the development of our trainees and staff. One of our strengths is the diversity of these groups and therefore we are looking for people who can demonstrate the following:

- ☐ passionate about using ELAM's Vision to deliver outstanding outcomes;
- ☐ takes an honest, respectful and empathetic approach to people and situations;
- ☐ willing to have a strong, open and honest relationship with colleagues; and
- ☐ demonstrate high levels of professionalism.

### ***Collaboration***

Our success to date has been based on the fact that we have been able to work together as a team effectively. We want to retain our collaborative culture and environment as we grow and we are therefore looking for people who can demonstrate the following:

- ☐ experience collaborating with other teachers or departments to improve practice;
- ☐ outstanding relationship building skills;
- ☐ engaging and able to quickly build rapport with young people in a KS5 environment;
- ☐ able to establish good working relationships with staff, trainees, parents and other relevant stakeholders including external agencies;

- ☐ able to coach and support trainees individually as well as in groups.

Our work is hard; we are constantly solving new problems and we fail regularly. As a result of this, we have to be able to commit to a process of continuous learning and development in order to keep moving forward and avoid making the same mistakes. We are therefore looking for people who:

- ☐ a belief in the capacity for achievement in spite of circumstance;
- ☐ a commitment to CPD and strengthening pedagogy;
- ☐ a strong aptitude for learning to continuously develop personally and professionally; and
