



Job Description: Teacher of Physical Education

General Responsibilities

1. To teach Physical Education under the direction of the Head of Department.
2. To undertake such duties as shall from time to time be delegated by the Head of Department.
3. To make a positive contribution to the development of the work of the department.
4. To share in the organisation and running of the extra-curricular activities of the department.
5. To be responsible for the setting, marking and assessment of work in line with department policy.

Additional Specific Responsibilities

1. To be a Form Tutor if so required and to carry out the related duties in accordance with the general job description of Form Tutor.

General Duties

1. To carry out a share of supervisory duties in accordance with published rosters.
2. To participate in appropriate meetings with colleagues and parents relative to the above duties.

Notes:

- (i) The above responsibilities are subject to the general duties and responsibilities contained in the current School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document.
- (ii) This job description allocates duties and responsibilities but does not direct the particular amount of time to be spent on carrying them out and no part of it may be so construed. In allocating time to the performance of duties and responsibilities the post-holder must use Directed Time in accordance with the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document.
- (iii) This job description is not necessarily a comprehensive definition of the post. It will be reviewed at least once a year and it may be subject to modification or amendment at any time after consultation with the holder of the post.

Selection Criteria

A. General

1. Enthusiasm for teaching and a commitment to education.
2. Sympathy with and willingness to support the Christian ethos of the school.
3. Ability to demonstrate an understanding of and sympathy with the equal opportunities policies of the school and of the LEA.
4. Understanding of pastoral needs of pupils from varied social and cultural backgrounds.

B. Specialist

1. Appropriate qualifications (e.g. degree in Physical Education) .
2. Successful teaching experience in Physical Education in secondary schools.
3. The ability to demonstrate managerial and administrative skills within the classroom.
4. Knowledge of National Curriculum requirements in the teaching of Physical Education .
5. Commitment to improving Physical Activity and fitness within the school.
6. Evidence of in-service training relevant to this post and willingness to undertake extra training courses.
7. The ability to demonstrate an understanding of curriculum development.
8. A willingness to contribute to extra-curricular activities including after school hours.

PLEASE NOTE:

Although the school is situated inside the congestion zone there is a back gate for staff to use which is outside the zone and avoids the charge.
