





GENERAL BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Walton High opened in 1999 with 120 Year 8 students. Since then the school has grown; has opened a second campus at Brooklands and now has over 1750 students on roll, including over 350 Post 16. The school has an excellent reputation and is consistently oversubscribed.

In 2011 the Governors of Walton High founded Milton Keynes Education Trust with the following aims:

Walton High is committed to making personalised learning a reality. Our flexible and varied curriculum is an essential foundation for this, providing as it does personal learning pathways which are challenging, relevant and significant.

Personalised learning and teaching is a commitment to ensuring **all learners** reach or exceed expectation, fulfil early promise and develop latent potential. At the heart of personalisation is the expectation of participation, fulfilment and success. Computing and ICT @ Walton High

Computing and ICT is a strong and highly motivated team of professionals. Staff have high expectations and work well together to create an atmosphere in which all students can fulfil their potential. The Curriculum Area currently comprises of four teachers who contribute to the teaching of Computing / ICT.

Resources

The Curriculum Area currently has a suite of seven fully equipped BE/Computing classrooms at its Walton Campus. All rooms have either ceiling mounted projectors or interactive smartboards. The Independent Learning Area provides access to a further 125 networked computers. There are five computer technicians to maintain and provide service across the school.
