GENERAL

An enthusiastic, well-qualified Teacher of Biology is required from September 2017 to teach Biology across the age range of the School (11-18). The successful applicant will join a large and successful department.

THE DEPARTMENT

The Biology Department currently consists of 10 full-time teachers and 2 technical staff. The Biology Office is a modern, well-appointed and spacious facility that offers a pleasant working environment. The subject is taught in seven well equipped laboratories situated together on the top floor, over-looking the school fields. The labs have all been fully refurbished and offer superb, flexible teaching spaces. All labs have interactive whiteboards and video/DVD player. They also have Airplay so that it is possible to project from an iPad. There is also the facility to use IT applications in a dedicated science IT laboratory. We are proud of our strong emphasis on carrying out practical work in lessons.

We are delighted that Biology exam results are consistently excellent, with over 50% of boys attaining A* at GCSE and, 30% attaining an A* at A level in most years. Many boys go on to study Biology related degrees including Medicine, Biological Sciences and Natural Sciences.

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

This is an excellent opportunity to join a busy and successful department in an outstanding School. The successful candidate will be expected to teach 30 (40 minute) lessons per week, which would potentially include a games afternoon and a form tutor period. The role involves planning appropriate lessons and dealing with marking and reporting. In this academically selective school, the challenges include stretching the most able up to Oxbridge level. Some contribution to the wider life of the School is also expected from staff at Hampton.

PERSON SPECIFICATION - SKILLS, QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE Essential Criteria:

- A good honours graduate from a good university ideally in Biology but possibly in, Natural Sciences or Biochemistry.
- An enthusiasm for Biology and the ability to convey this to pupils
- The ability to demonstrate characteristics of outstanding teaching practice
- An awareness of the demands of teaching bright students and a commitment to fostering high academic achievement
- The ability to work independently and as part of a team and a willingness to contribute to departmental resources
- A professional approach which inspires confidence in pupils and parents
- Excellent communication and ICT skills
- Calmness and efficiency, with the ability to work under pressure at times
- Commitment to continuing professional development through attendance at INSET
- Commitment to the all-round ethos of the School, including its co-curricular activities and pastoral approach

Desirable Criteria

- A higher degree or experience of educational or subject-specific research
- A teaching qualification and/or some previous teaching experience
- The ability to develop and maintain effective relationships with all members of the School community and outside agencies
